

Faith: Conviction about Things We Cannot See

Christopher Columbus (1451-1506) was one of the world's greatest navigators, whose four voyages to the Western Hemisphere opened the way for European exploration and colonization of the New World and irreversibly changed the course of history. When Columbus sailed from Palos, Spain, on August 3, 1492, with his three ships-the Nina, the Pinta, and Santal Maria-he was venturing into the unknown, for as yet no human being had dared to go out westward as far as he planned to go. The Encyclopedia Britanica has the following note about this famous journey: "Once the three ships finally lost sight of land (September 9), the greatness of Columbus began to reveal itself, for it was at this moment that he conquered by faith and will power the resistance of the unbelieving and faint-hearted members of his crew" (vol. 4, p. 938).

It is interesting to notice the choice of words, in the sentence just quoted from the Encyclopaedia Britanica. It speaks-in a secular sense, of course-of the faith of Columbus as opposed to the unbelief of his crew. Yet, it we compare this sentence with the definition of faith proposed in today's second reading by the author of the Letter to the Hebrews (Hebrews 11:1-2, 8-9), the choice of words of the Encyclopedia Britanica makes good sense. The text of the Letter to the Hebrews says: "Faith is confident assurance concerning what we hope for, and conviction about things we do not see." That was exactly the frame of mind of Columbus: he hoped to find as yet undiscovered about things he could not see. Hence the members of KofC are gentlemen of strong faith and defenders of the Catholic Faith.

Our faith as Christians is, like that of Columbus and of all believers in God, "confident assurance concerning what we hope for, and conviction about things we do not see." But what we hope for and cannot see yet is not a New World or a scientific discovery or anything merely human. The object of our faith is much bigger. In fact, it is infinite, for what we hope for and convince about although we cannot see it yet is nothing less thank God himself and life in Heaven with him one day in perfect.

This Sunday Goepel (Lk 12:32-48) portrays a master returning suddenly late at night from a wedding and finding his servants ready to welcome him. This master stands for Christ. One day he will return to fetch us on the day of our death. Will we be ready to meet him then? For now, death seems a remote possibility to most of us, especially if we are young and healthy. Moreover, our modern culture avoids the topic of death as much as possible. That is not surprising because, from a because, from a secular and materialistic viewpoint, death is the greatest of all evils, and the end of life on earth is the end of everything. But Christians have an altogether different viewpoint. We leave behind earthly goods and joys to possess those of Heaven, which are far greater and will never be taken aways. Our faith will never be in vain!


