The ever-present Threat of Idolatry

The greatest sign God gave the Israelites of his love for them was when he delivered them from slavery in Egypt. Yet, shortly after their deliverance from Egypt, they fell back into idolatry, as the Frist Reading tells us.

We might think that idolatry belongs to primitive peoples and to a bygone age. Unfortunately, this is not so. Modern people have their idols too.

And how they worship those idols! They may not get down on their knees before them, or offer sacrifices to them, but they worship them in other ways.

Whenever anything usurps the place God should occupy, then idolatry enters our life. Money is probably the most common idol today. But there are others - possessions, pleasure, success, fame, and power. A life based on the worship of things is a life of idolatry. When we are wealthy, fed and healthy we quickly forget God.

What is enthroned in our heart becomes the substance of our desires and the object of our strivings. In short, it becomes our god. We worship what we love.

Idolatry leads at best to a superficial life, and at worst to a debased life. But the greatest harm idolatry does is that it causes us to forget the true God. Jesus shows us who God is, and how we can keep God at the centre of our lives. God is not some remote and uncaring figure. God is or heavenly Father, who is close to us, and to whom we are important and precious.

We must strive to keep God at the centre of our hearts. And we must try to serve God with an undivided heart. Because only God can fill our empty hearts.

But we must be on our guard. We are an obstinate people. We have a tendency to follow the devices of our own heart, and so we err and stray from God like lost sheep.

The First Reading seems to portray God as an angry, jealous God, who will resort to most terrible punishments when his law is disobeyed. But that's not the message of the story. The message is that God pardons the sin of his people in response to the prayer of Moses.

We must not worship God out of fear. We must worship God out of love. It was God who first loved us. Our love is a response to God's love for us. And God's love is the only star that never ceases to shine for us.
