The Cost of Discipleship

Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem, and people where joining him. Jesus knew that suffering, rejection and death awaited him at the end of his journey. But it seems that some of these would-be followers regarded it as a victory march of the Messiah.

Jesus dispelled any romantic view they might have of discipleship. He told them in no uncertain terms that it wouldn't be easy. So they could not complain later on, "Oh, we never thought it would was going to be like this." He suggested that calculation should have a role to play in their decision to follow him, pointing out that discipleship is a serious calling. It could mean persecution and even death. In this, as in any other sphere of life (such as business and politics), one should not walk into it blindly. One should calculate the cost before committing to it, and see if one has what it takes.

Finally Jesus said, "No one can be my disciple unless he gives up all his possessions." He doesn't mean that a disciple must be destitute. The life of the the poor, with its hardship and suffering, is not set forth in the Gospel as an idea for the Christian disciple. But neither is the desire for possessions and the accumulation of wealth.

Jesus had one great goal in life, namely, to carry out the task his Father had given him. That's whay he lived for. And he was willing to pay whatever price was demanded in order to fulfil that task. And he expected nothing less from his disciples.

The goal Jesus sets before us is immensely worthwhile - the goal of an authentic way of life here and eternal life hereafter. There is no higher goal than that. That doesn't mean it is easy. No one can be a disciple without carrying the cross. But Jesus knows our fragility. He lavishes his grace on those who strive sincerely to follow him.

We can draw encouragement from the example of the apostles. The Gospels show that they struggled at every point to follow Jesus. Yet he did not write them off. By looking at them we discover our own inadequacies.

The Gospel offers hope to Christians who fail. Repentance and a second chance are always possible. Jesus is generous with his grace to those who strive to answer his call.

St. Mary's Restoration Appeal

We would like to take a moment to thank you for the incredible ways you continue to support and strengthen our parish family. As you know this appeal is to deal with deferred maintenance and mold remediation of the rectory/church and the unexpected expenses from relocating our priests. The associated costs has created a need for additional income outside of the regular donation streams of our parish. The diocese wants an engineering firm to help us clearly determine the steps and costs needed to make the spaces safe, free from mold and functional. After consulting with some professional fundraisers, we learned many churches make the mistake of using endowed or reserve funds to make the repairs without asking the congregation to contribute, leaving them financially handicapped to deal with any unforeseen damages created by an act of God, or otherwise. We don't want to make that mistake.

I am sure you will share in our frustration of not knowing what the final costs will be until the engineering report is back with their findings and estimate for how long restorations will take and consequently, how long our priests will be renting a place down the road. Every effort is being made to make sure you are fully informed with all the information regarding this restoration and appeal.

So here is our plan. We will provide a weekly scorecard in the bulletins with new information as it comes in such as:

- Updates on the progress of the restorations.
- Fundraising efforts and associated restoration/relocation
- Our clergy will work with the diocese and update us, so we are approaching this as one family.

How do we raise the funds?

We have started with asking parishioners to contribute using a special restoration appeal collection envelope. You can give once or as many times as you wish. And we are extremely thankful for all donations to date!

In a recent meeting we decided to make it even easier for you to donate. Next week we will have a QR code available so you can donate using your credit card, with options for monthly pledging, one time donating and more. Your monetary donations over \$20 will receive a charitable tax
