

#### BE MERCIFUL TO ME O GOD, I AM A SINNER!

Since prayer brings us face to face with God, when we really think of it, how inadequate and deflating we can feel knowing our human frailties and fallings. But the humility of God alone soaks with his compassion and kindness lifts us up and continuously cheering us on. When we recognize our human weakness and still choose to honor God with it, we mirror the humility of Christ himself who though God and did not hold on to equality with God but became a human being like us to offer us a way out. As the Church presents us with the prayer encounters of a Pharisee and a Publican with God, we are reminded that God's way is one of humility, equality and perseverance in the pursuit of love. The Book of Sirach 32:14, 16-18 emphasises the Lord's focus on the needs of the poor and the marginalised. God calls us to be persistent in our prayer and uncompromising in our quest for justice. This theme is continued in the Psalm, (Ps 34), which reminds us that the Lord always hears our prayers of pain and distress, and responds to petitions that seek to do good in the world.

In his letter to Timothy, St. Paul encourages us to stand strong in the face of suffering, criticism and rejection, and to remain fixed on what is right and loving in the eyes of the Lord.

As prayer is a time of communion with God, it should always inspire us to want to find a quiet place and take as long as we need to settle down and set aside whatever might be whirling around in our mind and become aware that the Lord is very close and understands us through and through.

Being an intimate time with Jesus, imagine how you would feel receiving a letter from Jesus like this letter of St. Paul to Timothy. For me, I will dwell for a while on the relevance of these words to my own life. Perhaps there are things that haven't worked out as I'd planned or hoped. My actions may have brought criticism or judgment from others.

I will need to confide in the Lord my feelings about those experiences, and other people's reactions. I pray that I may let go of any sense of shame, regret or bitterness. I focus instead on the opportunities any suffering brings for new learning and growth. I may feel drawn to recall when and how the Lord made himself known to me in my struggles.

I consider how I might pass his love, compassion and encouragement onto others, even those whose politics, values or lifestyle may be radically different from my own. When I am ready, I end with a prayer of thanksgiving to the Lord who, even in my darkest hours and feelings of weakness, will forever stand by me.

May God bless you and continue to increase the strength of your prayer-life! Fr. Dominick
