Poverty of Heart

Today we would call Lazarus a 'down-and-out'. From time to time all of us encounter people like that. I think it is true to say that most of us find such encounters disturbing and humbling. Why is this? We find these encounters disturbing because they arouse within us

conflicting feelings of pity, discomfort, anger and guilt. We find them humbling because when we look at them, we realize that we too are poor, only in a different way. Down-and-outs are poor materially. We are poor in compassion, poor in our willingness to help, poor in our capacity to love. In other words, poor at heart.

When we think of poverty, we tend to think only of material poverty. But there is a worse kind of poverty - poverty of the heart.

The rich man and Lazarus lived in different worlds. The rich man was dressed in purple robes; Lazarus was dressed in rags. The rich man was healthy; Lazarus was covered in sores. The rich lived in a palace; Lazarus lived in the streets.

In fact, to say that they lived in different worlds would be an understatement. They lived in opposite worlds. The rich man lived in a garden. Lazarus lived in a desert. The rich man was in an earthly paradise, Lazarus in an earthly hell. And yet, though their respective worlds were as different as day and night, they lay side by side.

The rich man could easily have entered Lazarus' lonely, desperate world, and made contact with him. But he didn't. He shut him out of his palace and out of his heart. He failed to see him as a fellow human being, much less a brother with whom he shared a common humanity.

Lazarus was about as poor as any man could be. Yet, in a sense, the rich man was even poorer. How could that be? Lazarus was suffering from material poverty. The rich man was suffering from poverty of the heart. His heart was devoid of compassion and love. Even the street dogs had more compassion than he. A person like the rich man would be poor even if he owned the whole world. The rich are wounded by their riches, just as the poor are wounded by their poverty.

Nowhere in the parable is it suggested that the rich man's wealth was ill gotten or that Lazarus was the victim of his oppression. If the rich man was brought before a court, he could in all truth have protested, 'I did nothing wrong.' What then is his sin? His sin is omission.

The rich man was condemned, not because he was rich, but because he didn't show compassion in the poor man. Sin is not just about doing wrong. It is also about not doing good. Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta said, "The greatest evil in the world today is the terrible indifference towards one's neighbour which is so widespread."

The only riches worth having are the riches of the heart. Jesus compared the heart to a storehouse. If we wish to know how wealthy we are, let us not waste our time counting our possessions, or looking into our bank account. Let us look rather into the storehouse of our heart. To close ones heart is to begin to die; to open it is to begin to live.
