Blind Eyes

Pastor Tanner's sermon this last Sunday focused on the **story of the blind man in John, chapter 9.**

It's a story packed with nuance, detail and disquised call-backs. This man was living from a point of pain and blindness and all of the sudden he encountered Jesus. (a man he can't see) and suddenly he's living in this new paradigm of sight and light. Jesus broke all the rules of the sabbath to heal this man. He made mud with dirt and spit to bring the man life, just like God formed

man from dust and breathed life into him in Genesis.

Although Jesus initiated the healing, the man had to go in blind faith and wash his eyes in the pool as he was told. We see genuine, immediate faith from the blind man. But the religious leaders rejected Jesus, despite all the evidence they had of the miracle.

Tanner made it pretty clear: "Jesus didn't come to judge you. He came to save you. But if you don't see your need for him, then you're blind."




WEDNESDAY NIGHTS
