Dear Chris;

Dyslexia BC is writing today to give our full support to both resolutions that the *Kootney Lake DPAC* (SD8) has brought forward to the spring *BCCPAC* AGM. The first resolution is *"Replacing all Reading Programs to Align with the Science of Reading;"* and the second is for *"Literacy Centers, Funding and Policy"*.

We are really pleased that these resolutions have advanced to the table because it will help raise literacy rates across the province for all students and bring equitable access for our most vulnerable learners.

A year ago the Ontario Human Rights Commission released the "Right to Read "; Public inquiry into human rights issues affecting students with reading disabilities. Dyslexia BC hears from families on a daily basis about their struggles trying to access supports in the BC system. We have the same systemic issues in BC as Ontario does. Parents in BC have to pay out of pocket for resources for dyslexia because the system doesn't support them.

On December 7th, 2022, the new *Education Mandate* was released and it included "dyslexia initiatives". We should move ahead with this. There needs to be a shift in the BC curriculum toward the use of structured literacy with properly-tiered (or appropriately-tiered) interventions that begins with screening for dyslexia and other reading issues in kindergarten. As the parent voice in BC, *BCCPAC* could help BC move forward with this.

The prominent researcher, *Dr. Sally Shaywitz (Yale Center for Dyslexia)*, states, "We do not have a knowledge gap, we have an action gap."
