Dyslexia BC's Main Goal: Equitable Access for Individuals with Learning Disabilities (LD) in British Columbia, irrespective of age.

How do we think this can be achieved?

With Legislation and Policy to:

- Screen for dyslexia in KG (with funding)*
- Use **structured literacy** in All classrooms*
- Teacher training
- Specialized Literacy Centers in each district
- Access to Diagnosis MSP (only disability that has to pay) and remediation
- Access to Diagnosis or at least screening to get supports as an adult

⁻Most people here have had to pay for a private assessment, remediation, and for private resources.

- -There are only a couple of BC districts that provide remedial centers for learning disabilities, but they are not monitored for quality and it is unclear how effective they are.
- -All of these remedial centers are in the Lower Mainland.*
- -The private centers and schools are not monitored for quality either. Parents are left trying to choose what's best without unbiased support.
- -The cost is 2 to 3 times as much as regular tutoring and the private schools are substantially more expensive than the regular private schools.
- -Many of the charities and nonprofits that provide services for students with learning disabilities are biased because they are backed by companies that provide services for dyslexia.
