<b>Special Olympics Maryland:</b> The mission of Special Olympics is to provide
year- round sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for children and adults with intellectual disabilities. The Detachment supports events such as the Bowling Tournament, Polar Plunge and Winter Games.  Send two (2) members to participate at an event or donate \$1.00 per member to the program.
National Emergency Fund: Established after Hurricane Hugo in 1989, the National Emergency Fund has delivered over \$10 million in aid to Legionnaires, helping prevent post closures and support recovery. With grants of up to \$3,000 for individuals and \$10,000 for posts, the NEF ensures rapid relief when it's needed most.  Donate \$1.00 per member to the program.
Casey Cares: Casey Cares helps keep families' spirits high by arranging palliative programming, whether it's a care package for a simple movie night and a fresh pair of pajamas, visiting a live show, going to the zoo or attending a major sporting event.  Donate \$1.00 per member to the program or hold a pajama and/or supply collection.
<b>BeTheOne:</b> The mission of The American Legion's Be the One initiative is to reduce the rate of veteran suicide. We're actively working on ending the stigma associated with mental health treatment and empowering everyone to take appropriate action when a veteran or service member may be at risk, one life at a time.
Donate \$1.00 per member to the program or host a BeTheOne training seminar or community event.
Patriot Point (Commander's Project): Patriot Point is the Military Bowl Foundation's 294-acre retreat that provides a safe, secure and tranquil outdoor recreational retreat facility for wounded, ill, and injured active duty service members, veterans, their families and caregivers who face daily struggles related to their time spent defending our great nation.

<b>Laps of Love:</b> Laps of Love is held annually at the Detachment of Maryland Convention supporting various children & youth programs.

ATTEND TWO REGION MEETINGS  AMERICAN LEGION	Attend Two Region Meetings: Each Squadron is placed into a Region specific to their location. Each Region oversees 20-30 Squadrons to share information, assistance and provide a shared voice. Each Region selects Detachment Executive Committeemen and Delegates based on their membership total. The participation of each Squadron is highly encouraged.  Have a member(s) attend at least two Region Meetings. Current Region or Detachment Officers do not count for this purpose.  American Legion Family Day: Held on the last Saturday of April, Posts are encouraged to open their doors to members of their community to promote our programs and celebrate the accomplishments of the American Legion Family. Activities can include displays, activities for all ages, food and more!
FAMILY DAY	Maryland Gold Star Run: Join this multi day annual event traditionally held in June, as American Legion Riders and supporters across Maryland ride to raise funds for the American Legion Veteran and Children's Foundation. VCF delivers needed aid for military and veteran parents who face unexpected financial hardships. This organization also trains Department and Post level Veteran Service Officers.  Donate \$1.00 per member to the program and consider participating in the ride.
CWF	Child Well-Being Foundation: The American Legion Child Well-Being Foundation formally known as Child Welfare Foundation provides grants to nonprofit organizations that address the physical, mental, emotional and spiritual needs of children across the nation. These homes are located at military and VA medical centers around the world. (Bethesda, MD) Fisher Houses have up to 21 suites, with private bedrooms and baths. Families share a common kitchen, laundry facilities, a warm dining room, and an inviting living room.  Donate \$1.00 per member to the program or collect items to be donated on the wish list provided.
PRESIDENTS PROJECT	Department of Maryland Auxiliary President's Project (Girls State): Held at Salisbury University in June, this program is a civic and government- orientated program designed for our future generation of lady leaders, fully sponsored and hosted by the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Maryland.  Donate \$1.00 per member to the program and assist in promoting this program to your local community.

Toys for Tots does not accept realistic looking weapons and gifts with food. If donated, such items will NOT be distributed.  Each year the Detachment of Maryland collects new unwrapped toys at our Fall DEC Meeting which will be held on November 8, 2025, at Towson Post 22.  Donate new unwrapped toys or donate \$1.00 per member to Toys for Tots.
SERVING DIR COUNTRY'S NUMBER HERDES SHARPTOWN & MD	Heroes Haven: Heroes Haven teams up with others in the community to provide resources to our Heroes when they need it. Support to local veteran agencies, assistive devices such as ramps and track chairs, obtaining service dogs, outdoor sporting opportunities including our own hunt week and more.  Donate \$1.00 per member to Heroes Haven or attend a sponsored fundraising event such as the Annual Crab Feast or Golf Tournament.

ATTEND TWO DEC MEETINGS	Attend Two DEC Meetings: Sharing of ideas and collecting information to disseminate to our blue cap members is imperative for the success of our Squadrons and American Legion Programs. Attendance of these meetings by our Squadrons ensures information is being communicated and reaching our members.  Have a member(s) attend at least two DEC Meetings. Current Region Commanders, Detachment Officers or DEC'men do not count for this purpose.
Blood	Blood Drive: The American Legion Blood Donor Program has existed officially since 1942 to help that cause. A healthy donor may donate red blood cells every 56 days or double red blood cells every 112 days, according to the Red Cross. Posts interested in hosting drives can set up a blood drive by contacting one of their local blood banks.  Organize and host a blood drive at your Post or donate \$1.00 per member to the American Red Cross or local blood bank.
MARYLAND BOYS STATE	Maryland Boys State: American Legion Boys State is among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for junior high school students. It is a participatory program where each participant becomes a part of the operation of his local, county and state government. Boys State has been a program of The American Legion since 1935. Maryland Boys State is held in June of each year at McDaniel College.  Host a young man to attend Boys State or donate \$1.00 per member toward the program. (SAL members are eligible to become Boys State Counselors)
Charlotte Hall  Veterans  Home  Nerous Affair	Charlotte Hall Veterans Home: Charlotte Hall Veterans Home has been proudly "Serving Those Who Served" since 1985. The Home is situated on 126 beautiful acres in St. Mary's County and offers a continuum of care from the 126-bed assisted living program to the 318-bed skilled nursing program. Charlotte Hall Veterans Home also offers memory care in secure units.  Donate needed items included on the wish list or donate \$1.00 per member.
ÖCW	Operation Comfort Warrior: Ensuring the health and morale of those currently serving and the well-being of Veterans are essential to the purposes of this program. The Legion provides items and services through programs and entities that provide aid and comfort services to the recipients and their families. Family is an enormous part of the recovery process. Event grants may include a recipient's family. OCW can provide outings to amusement parks and other outdoor activities such as sporting events and fishing trips.  Donate \$1.00 per member toward this program.
MEMBERSHIP RETENTION	90 percent Retention: Our members are the heart of our organization and are relied on for our daily operations, support within our communities and success of our programs. Communication and engagement is a must for the retention and involvement of our members year after year. 2025 membership cards expire December 31, 2025 and members become delinquent as of January 1 <sup>st</sup> . Members not renewed by February 1 <sup>st</sup> are no longer in good standing and all rights and privileges as a member are suspended.
