January 16 Second Sunday after the Epiphany Human Relations Day

The Season after the Epiphany is a season of Ordinary Time in that it stands between the great Christological cycles of Advent-Christmas-Epiphany and Lent-Easter-Pentecost. The First Sunday focuses on the Baptism of Christ and the Last Sunday on the

Transfiguration. The Gospel readings in the lectionary center on the early ministry of Christ. The liturgical color between the First and Last Sundays is green, symbolizing growth in Christ.

January 16 is Human Relations Day in the United Methodist Church. Observed on the Sunday before Martin Luther King, Jr's birthday, this day calls the Church to recognize the right of all God's children to realize their potential as human beings in relationship with one another. The special offering received this Sunday supports Community Developers, United Methodist Volunteer Service, and Youth Offender Rehabilitation programs. A designated offering envelope will be inserted in the worship bulletin.

CHURCH RESPONSE TO DEVASTATING FIRE IN THE BRONX, NY

On January 9th a devastating fire occurred at a high-rise apartment building in the Bronx that claimed 17 lives, including 8 children, and injured many more. 21 families have been displaced. The enormity of this disaster is hard to overstate. One family of 12 who lost all of their possessions in the fire is a part of Tremont United Methodist Church, which serves that neighborhood under the leadership of Rev. Dr. Leslie Duroseau. We've received word from the church and the community for how we can help. Let's put our love into action.

There are several ways to help.

- First Spanish United Methodist Church in New York is collecting toiletries, blankets, coats, clothing and bottled water.
- To support the family of 12 who are Tremont UMC members, you may give directly to them through Cash App. The family member's account is under the name of Nikeya Gonzalez (646-260-6974).

Because the congregation gave so generously to the "Share the Warmth" clothing drive the decision was made to donate a portion of what was collected to those left homeless and have lost all their possessions. **HOWEVER**, as I was contacting people about getting our clothing donation to the city, I was told they are no longer taking clothing donations. They are still taking toiletries and

bottled water but by the time we could get that together that may also no longer be a need. <u>Financial aid will likely be the longer</u> term need and we can continue to promote all those avenues.

It is celebrated on the Sunday before the observance of Martin Luther King, Jr.'s birthday. This offering was originally established in 1972 to fund Self-Determination Projects, The Black Community Developers and the Police-Community Relations Program. In 1988, the offering was designated to support ministries of social justice and outreach to at-risk youth. Specific ministries include the Community Developers Program, United Methodist Voluntary Services Program and the Youth Offender Rehabilitation Program. The fund is administered by the General Board of Global Ministry and the General Board of Church and Society.
