WUMC Scholarship Program

This scholarship fund began in 1998. *Jen* and *Rod Carnes* had the original vision for this fund and made an initial donation for the first few years to seed this important ministry which recognizes this transitional time in the lives of our youth. In years since the fund has been sustained by some additional contributions from Jen and Rod, but mainly from annual contributions flowing from the proceeds of the WUMC golf tournament and other fundraising activities, such as pasta dinners, tag sales, etc.; scholarships have been granted. To this date in 2021, WUMC has awarded sixty scholarships to graduating seniors of over \$32,150.

Church members can help support the fund through a direction contribution to WUMC designated to the Scholarship Fund. All contributions are welcome from a few dollars to estate giving of any substantial amounts.

Another way to support the fund and other WUMC mission work is to support our church fundraising activities. Even though we have not scheduled a tournament in a few years, it may be in the future planning under new leadership. In that regard, we welcome golf participants, flag sponsors, donations of prizes for raffles or silent auction, and direct contributions in any amount.


