

SCRIPTURE READING

*Gospel Lesson: 2 Corinthians 3:1-6, 12-18 NRSV

Are we beginning to commend ourselves again? Surely we do not need, as some do, letters of recommendation to you or from you, do we? You yourselves are our letter, written on our hearts, to be known and read by all; and you show that you are a letter of Christ, prepared by us, written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone but on tablets of human hearts.

Such is the confidence that we have through Christ toward God. Not that we are competent of ourselves to claim anything as coming from us; our competence is from God, who has made us competent to be ministers of a new covenant, not of letter but of spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life.

Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.

Rev. Maria-Pia Seirup is the Executive Director of PeaceWork, inc. After serving for 16 years on the staff of Jesse Lee Memorial UMC, Rev. Maria-Pia founded PeaceWork, inc. in the winter of 2020. The PeaceWork ministry combines her passion for artisan work, contemplative prayer, and creating welcoming spaces where people can explore their faith and experience God's transforming power.

Her artisan work includes designing and creating unique clergy vestments, and church paraments, as well as quilting, sewing, and knitting items as compassionate, useful gifts to those in need.

Rev. Maria-Pia currently leads a weekly contemplative prayer group on Zoom that is open to all -- no experience necessary. If you wish to give it a try, email her for the Zoom link.

In the spring of 2020, Rev. Maria-Pia's work focused on leading a group of 25+ sewists from the Ridgefield area who made over 2,400 masks for essential workers and vulnerable individuals.

In the summer, Rev. Maria-Pia is chaplain at Camp Kingswood, our conference's 760 acre camp in Hancock, NY in the beautiful Catskills. In August, she also leads a yearly Women's Apart Retreat focusing on spiritual growth and handwork. The retreat is open to all women who wish to learn more about practicing God's presence in their everyday life.
