Lasson

Read Mark 10:46-52 with your family this week. Have any of you seen a baby recently? Do you remember when you were a baby? One thing I know about babies is that they're not shy when it comes to letting you know when they want something. They'll let you know when they're hungry, thirsty, sick, tired, or need a diaper change. Babies let you know what they need by crying. Babies don't care if you're in church, at a movie, or eating dinner in a fine restaurant; if they need something, they'll tell you. As we get older, we learn to be more reserved about making our wants and wishes known. Or do we?

The Bible talks about a man who wasn't scared to let Jesus know he needed something. As Jesus and His disciples were leaving a town called Jericho, a blind man named Bartimaeus was sitting beside the road. When he heard that Jesus was approaching, he began to cry out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" His crying out disturbed the people around him. "Be quiet!" they yelled at him. But he only shouted louder. When Jesus heard Bartimaeus crying out, He stopped and said, "Tell him to come to me." Bartimaeus jumped up, threw aside his coat, and went to Jesus. "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked. "I want to see," Bartimaeus answered. "Go," Jesus said. "Your faith has healed you." Instantly, Bartimaeus could see and he followed Jesus down the road.



God and the Pandemic: A Christian Reflection on the Coronavirus and Its Aftermath by NT Wright



- Family crisis support (e.g., child/elder/respite care, meals)
- · Friendly visitor

Nominal Constraints:

- Short-term crisis support: 4-8 hours; 1-2 days
- Work projects: Ideally done in 1 day; up to \$200 for material cost
- · Application approval predicated on resource availability and schedule
