Dear WUMC family,

Our desire at WUMC is to be "good stewards of the manifold grace of God" (1 Peter 4:10).

Stewardship Sunday is November 21st, when we ask that you turn in your estimate of giving cards as part of a special worship service, followed by a time of fellowship and refreshments. We hope you will prayerfully consider your 2022 tithe or offering during the coming weeks, and look forward to seeing you there as we anticipate **a debt-free new beginning** and envision what's possible for WUMC in 2022.

Does that sound possible? An anonymous donor has offered a 2-for-1 match on donations designated to retire the mortgage; so now we only need to raise \$20,000 to be debt free and ready to focus on the next chapter I believe God has in store for our congregation. Will you join me in making this happen? We are blessed with many tools for ministry, including a wonderful church building and two parsonages, albeit with a mortgage on one of those. I ask you to please give to this great opportunity as you feel led. Please return your estimate of giving card by the end of 2021, reflecting what you can contribute towards retiring the mortgage by the end of 2022. Maintaining your current level of giving to WUMC, or even increasing it, ensures we will have the resources we need to spread the love of Christ through our worship, service, and witness as we work to reach new people. Let's take full advantage of this unusual opportunity to retire WUMC's debt and create a clean slate on which to build the next generation of WUMC ministry to the Woodbury community!

Children & Youth Ministry News

Lesson

Read Mark 1 Samuel 1:4-20 with your family this week, focusing on verse 11. Before you were even born, your parents spent a lot of time deciding what name they would give their new baby. That is a very important decision. After all, when you give a baby a name, it will live with that name for the rest of its life. One thing your parents considered was the sound of your name. Before they made their final decision, they said the name over and over again to see how it sounded. They wanted to make sure it sounded good with your middle name and your last name. Your parents also wanted a name that would be special, but they didn't want it to be too strange. They surely didn't want to choose a name that would cause other children to tease you about it. Some names have some special meanings which your parents may have thought about. Maybe they chose a name with a meaning that reflected qualities that they hoped their child would possess.

There is a story in the Bible about a woman whose name was Hannah. Her name means "God is gracious." I imagine that Hannah must have sometimes wondered why she was given that name, because it seemed that God had denied her the one thing she wanted more than anything in the world -- a son. One day, Hannah sat in the temple weeping and praying to God. As she was praying, she made a promise to God. "Oh Lord," Hannah prayed, "if you will look upon me in my misery and give me a son, I will present him back to you to be your servant all the days of his life." Eli, the priest in the temple stood nearby watching Hannah. He saw her lips moving, but he didn't hear any sound coming from her mouth. He thought that Hannah was drunk! "Not so," Hannah said to Eli, "I have had nothing to drink. I was only pouring out my soul to the Lord." The priest answered Hannah, "Go in peace, and may God grant you what you have asked of him." Guess what? God did grant Hannah's request! The Bible tells us that Hannah gave birth to a son and named him Samuel. Do you know why she chose that name for her son? Because Samuel means, "asked of God." Because God heard and answered her prayer, she was faithful to keep her promise to him. When he was old enough, Hannah took Samuel to the temple and there he served the Lord by assisting Eli the priest. God is so good! He hears and answers the prayers of his people. Sometimes we make promises to God. Are we, like Hannah, faithful in keeping our promises to God? I hope so!
