




Updates from CRT (Covid Response Team)

Read 1 Thessalonians 3:9-13 with your family this week. This is what Paul wrote to his friends in the city of Thessalonica while he was away:

"We pray that we can see you again and give you all the things you need to make your faith strong. We pray that our God and Father and our Lord Jesus will prepare the way for us to come to you. We pray that the Lord will make your love grow more and more for each other and for all people. We pray that you will love others as we love you and that your hearts will be made strong."

I wonder what Paul was feeling when he wrote this letter. I wonder if you've ever felt those feelings, too. I wonder what you do when you miss someone. I wonder if you've ever missed your home. I wonder what it feels like to have to leave your home.

The good news is that God is always with us, even when we are away from home, even when we miss the people we love, and we can wait with hope for the day we get to see them again.


HOUSEKEEPING NOTES FROM THE OFFICE...
