# For those that can't come to church "in person" please join us for Livestreamed Worship Events

Livestreaming provides an opportunity for all of us to experience worship at the same time, either at home or in-person. Worshipers at home may join us by video on YouTube or audio-only by telephone broadcast. Video recordings of services will also be available for later viewing. Later phone broadcasts are no longer provided.

The options for accessing services electronically remain the same:

- Video: Go to <a href="http://www.woodburyumc.net">http://www.woodburyumc.net</a>, scroll to the link for livestreaming near the top of our home page. A link is also provided for archived videos for later viewing.
- Audio only by phone: dial 425-436-6391, enter pin with hash sign 2431819#. Note that these numbers have changed from what was previously used. Please mute your phones to eliminate background noise.

### SAVE THE DATES: Discovering God's Vision for Your Life

### Updates from CRT (Covid Response Team)

Reminder: COVID Safety Protocols (last updated 22-Dec-2021)

Due to the recent spike in COVID cases, our protocols have been refined for Christmas Eve services and for the foreseeable future. A complete list of refined protocols is provided below.

- Pre-registration for worship services is now required. Please do so online if possible (see the link at the top of our homepage at <u>www.woodburyumc.net</u> or go directly to <u>https://rsvp.church/r/CqMXUVqE</u>). Those who need assistance with pre-registration may call Mark Davis at 860-882-4427.
- Masks are required for worship service and all church meetings/events. If a child is too young to wear a mask for the duration of a worship service or event, they should not attend in person.
- Our fully vaccinated and pre-screened worship team may remove masks while speaking/singing as long as enhanced sanctuary ventilation is used.
- Limit worship team singers to 3 distanced by 12 feet, unless a family unit; no congregational singing.
- Assigned seating will be used whenever more than 50 attendees are anticipated.
- Refrain from attending worship services/events in person if experiencing any cold, flu and/or COVID symptom within 10
  days of the event, unless a subsequent negative COVID PCR test result is obtained.
- A person who has been in close contact with a COVID infected person should be PCR tested 5-7 days (no sooner) after close contact and refrain from attending church events for 14 days or until a subsequent negative PCR test result is obtained.
- The worship team, greeters, and ushers should be fully vaccinated, including booster when eligible.
- Unvaccinated persons are encouraged to watch services/events from home, but will be accommodated if they choose to attend in person, as long as they comply with all safety protocols.

# **Children & Youth Ministry News**

Your Children & Teen Ministry team wish you all the joys of Christmas and look forward to brighter New Year with you. You are always invited and at home with us. This week read Luke 2:1-20 with your family. This is the story of Jesus' birth.

"While Joseph and Mary were in Bethlehem, the time came for her to have the baby. There were no rooms left in the inn. So she wrapped the baby with cloths and laid him in a box where animals are fed. That night, some shepherds were in the fields nearby watching their sheep. An angel of the Lord stood before them. The angel said to them, 'Don't be afraid, because I am bringing you some good news. It will be a joy to all the people. Today your Savior was born in David's town. He is Christ, the Lord. This is how you will know him: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a feeding box.' So the shepherds went quickly and found Mary and Joseph. And the shepherds saw the baby lying in a feeding box. Then they told what the angels had said about this child."

I wonder what Mary and Joseph felt when there was no room for them. I wonder what it felt like for the shepherds to get invited to meet Jesus. I wonder if the stable was crowded that night. I wonder what the animals thought of all these people in their home. I wonder what it feels like when you get invited to something special.

The good news is that God invites all of us to be close to Jesus, and anywhere we are together, even in a barn, God is there, too. Here are some ways you can extend the invitation home:

- Create an invitation for a friend to come to church with you.
- Play Sardines. One person goes to hide and the rest of the people seek the hider. When you find the hiding place, squeeze in until everyone is together.
- Read Room for a Little One by Martin Waddell and Jason Cockcroft.
- Learn about how other countries celebrate Christmas. What kinds of celebrations do they have? Which would you like to be invited to?

Children's additional items: onesies, sweaters, snow suits, leggings




#### HOUSEKEEPING NOTES FROM THE OFFICE...
