- Audio only by phone: dial 425-436-6391, enter pin with hash sign 2431819#. Note that these numbers have changed from what was previously used. Please mute your phones to eliminate background noise.

What is a Blue Christmas Service?

The format of Blue Christmas services vary church to church, but the common theme is dropping the usual merry and bright, and recognizing the hard stuff—loss, relationships, addiction — or just not feeling the festive joy we feel ought to come naturally. For those who associate Christmas with carols and ornaments and cozy family gatherings, it can seem strange to focus on such darkness. But this darkness has always been part of the story. At some point, all of us will be touched by darkness — if we're not living it right now. And if you look at the Christmas story, full of joyful promise, the darkness is there as well.

Blue Christmas (also called the Longest Night) is traditionally held on or around the longest night of the year, which falls on or about December 21, the Winter Solstice. Worship often includes opportunities for expression of grief and pain as well as an opportunity to focus on the promise of hope. The images of the winter solstice which include the longest night losing to the increasing longer day after midnight is a significant part of the imagery used in the elements of this particular worship event. There are growing resources and popularity around this tradition due to the relevance for many who struggle to find joy and hope during festive seasons.

"So there's this sense at Christmas that God's own self identifies with that sort of aloneness, and comes to be with people" comments theologian and educator Ben Stewart, who teaches worship at the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. "How do we hold together the kind of wonder at a little infant child, and still make sure that we're challenging the Herods of the world, who would oppress children?"

Stewart points to the hymn Sweet Little Jesus Boy, popularized by Mahalia Jackson: "The world treats you mean, lord. Treats me mean, too. But that's how things are down here."

"At its deepest level, I think the Christmas gospels tell the story of God's entrance into this world from the underside," says Stewart. "And when all of us gather there together, and the marginalized are in the center — that's the promise of Christmas." To realize this promise, Christians need liturgies and theologies deep enough to hold the darkness — the blues alongside the Christmas joy. But it's a deep, hopeful, midnight blue — one that has us looking toward the dawn.




Mission Statement of the Woodbury United Methodist Church
