Worship Together at the Same Time – 10:30 AM Live Streaming Continues

Livestreaming provides an opportunity for all of us to experience worship at the same time, but for the next few weeks at home. You can join us by video on YouTube or audio-only by telephone broadcast. Video recordings of services will also be available for later viewing. Later phone broadcasts are no longer provided.

The options for accessing services electronically remain the same:

- Video: Go to http://www.woodburyumc.net, scroll to the link for livestreaming near the top of our home page. A link is also provided for archived videos for later viewing.
- Audio only by phone: dial 425-436-6391, enter pin with hash sign 2431819#. Note that these numbers have changed from what was previously used. Please mute your phones to eliminate background noise.

COVID Response Team Update

We are delighted to announce that we plan to resume in-person worship on February 6th.

Why is it safe to return now? Our COVID response team has carefully re-evaluated our protocols and found that they are more than sufficient to allow us to worship together safely. Community spread is down and COVID tests are now more readily accessible to help distinguish between cold/flu and COVID symptoms. Finally, MIT modeling tools show that we can safely accommodate our max capacity of 75 people if we upgrade to multi-layer surgical or N/KN-95 masks, while continuing our previous safety protocols.

Here is how you can do your part to protect your church family at in-person worship:

- 1. Pre-register for the service on our website, www.woodburyumc.net.
- 2. Upgrade your mask to at least a surgical mask. We strongly encourage you to wear an N/KN 95 mask for increased protection. Both will be available to anyone who needs one at check-in.
- 3. If you or a family member is ill, please stay home and continue to enjoy the service online at our website, www.woodburyumc.net, or our YouTube channel at http://www.youtube.com/channel/UCN-kkokTCbVE9urwgP_AEcw.
- 4. Maintain your distance from other family units after briefly greeting one another.

AT HOME FAMILY SCRIPTURE READING & REFLECTION (ALL AGES)

Love Never Ends: Being The Body of Christ

This week's scripture talks about how Paul held onto his faith despite not having been personally with Jesus.

READ TOGETHER: This week as a family read the words of 1 Corinthians 15: 1-13 several times.

REFLECT TOGETHER: Family Discussion Questions

- What is some "good news" that you could share right now? (Note Have a family member jot these on paper to include these pieces of "good news" to your family prayer time. These could be personal items, stories from the community, or news that people are happy and excited about.)
- Why do you think the gospel is considered "good news"? (See verse 2.)
- What does Paul tell us to do with the gospel message in verse 2? (Hold it firmly.) Why is holding on to the good news important for Christians? How do you think this was helpful advice to early Christians? Why might it also be beneficial advice for us today?
- Verse 9 says, "For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle because I persecuted the church of God." What do you think it means to be called a Christian?
- Paul was happy to wear the label, "Christian". Do you think it is easy to publicly be known as a Christian now, or not?
- Have you ever felt like you didn't "deserve" to be called a Christian?
- How have you encountered the "good news" of God's love for yourself.

ACTIVITY: 1) "What's More Important" Game (Format like "Would You Rather")— One by one the leader (Take turns being the leader) asks the family the questions like those that follow family members respond by moving left (option A) or right (option

B): [A-Peanut Butter or B-Jelly]; {The Chocolate or Marshmallow in a S'more} [Exercise or Reading]; [Valentine's Day or Easter]; [Attending School or Attending Church]; [The Bible or (B) Hymnal in worship] [A lot of friends or a handful of really close friends]; 2) What's Important for Your Family Creed": Read the Apostles Creed together and discuss what is important to you as a family. PRAY TOGETHER: Include the "Good News" items from above in your family prayer.

Spirituality & Dementia


A Webinar with Lynn Casteel Harper March 3, 7-8 pm
