# Worship Together at the Same Time – 10:30 AM Live Streaming Continues

Livestreaming provides an opportunity for all of us to experience worship at the same time, but for the next few weeks at home. You can join us by video on YouTube or audio-only by telephone broadcast. Video recordings of services will also be available for later viewing. Later phone broadcasts are no longer provided.

The options for accessing services electronically remain the same:

- Video: Go to <u>http://www.woodburyumc.net</u>, scroll to the link for livestreaming near the top of our home page. A link is also provided for archived videos for later viewing.
- Audio only by phone: dial 425-436-6391, enter pin with hash sign 2431819#. Note that these numbers have changed from what was previously used. Please mute your phones to eliminate background noise.

# **COVID Response Team Reminders**

Our COVID response team has carefully re-evaluated our protocols and found that they are more than sufficient to allow us to worship together safely. Community spread is down and COVID tests are now more readily accessible to help distinguish between cold/flu and COVID symptoms. Finally, MIT modeling tools show that we can safely accommodate our max capacity of 75 people if we upgrade to multi-layer surgical or N/KN-95 masks, while continuing our previous safety protocols.

Here is how you can do your part to protect your church family at in-person worship:

- 1. Pre-register for the service on our website, <u>www.woodburyumc.net</u>.
- 2. Upgrade your mask to at least a surgical mask. We strongly encourage you to wear an N/KN 95 mask for increased protection. Both will be available to anyone who needs one at check-in.
- 3. If you or a family member is ill, please stay home and continue to enjoy the service online at our website, <u>www.woodburyumc.net</u>, or our YouTube channel at <u>http://www.youtube.com/channel/UCN-kkokTCbVE9urwgP\_AEcw</u>.
- 4. Maintain your distance from other family units after briefly greeting one another.

**FAMILY SCRIPTURE REFLECTION:** The scripture reading talks about the resurrection of Christ and how that relates to Resurrection or new life in our own bodies. Paul's words hint at the idea of "incarnation"—that we embody the spirit of the risen Jesus—that we can live new lives, free from death and sin because Jesus overcame death. This is one way of saying that life and how we live is important and that you matter to the church.

READ: 1 Corinthians 15:12-20

**REFLECTION:** Reflect and Discuss these questions as a family.

- Why do you think some members of the church in Corinth (the Corinthians) had a hard time believing in the resurrection of Jesus?
- Does the idea of an everlasting life help us live as Christians each day? How can we begin to live in an "everlasting way" right now?
- By staying active in our faith life, we avoid "falling asleep in Christ." Paul's version of staying active seems to hint at living "sacrificially" by asking us to give to God first and to ourselves second. What are some ways that you could show that God is a first priority in your life?




#### Mission Statement of the Woodbury United Methodist Church
