ST. PATRICK'S DAY CORNED BEEF AND CABBAGE DINNER




The C.C.C. camps were founded March 31, 1933 with President Franklin D. Roosevelt's "New Deal" program, to relieve the poverty and unemployment of the Depression. Men ages 18-25 (with families on relief) enrolled for 6 months and worked 40 hours a week for those 6 months. It was disbanded in 1942 due to the need of men in WWII.
