Worship Together at the Same Time – 10:30 AM Live Streaming Continues

Livestreaming provides an opportunity for all of us to experience worship at the same time, but for the next few weeks at home. You can join us by video on YouTube or audio-only by telephone broadcast. Video recordings of services will also be available for later viewing. Later phone broadcasts are no longer provided.

The options for accessing services electronically remain the same:

- Video: Go to http://www.woodburyumc.net, scroll to the link for livestreaming near the top of our home page. A link is also provided for archived videos for later viewing.
- Audio only by phone: dial 425-436-6391, enter pin with hash sign 2431819#. Note that these numbers have changed from what was previously used. Please mute your phones to eliminate background noise.

IMPORTANT UPDATE: COVID Response Team

We are delighted to announce that we plan to resume congregational singing on February 27th.

Our COVID response team has carefully evaluated the risks associated with congregational singing and have determined that our new mask protocols (surgical or N/KN-95) allow us to resume safely this joyous element of worship that has been sorely missed by many. Also, please take notice of the new large capacity HEPA air purifier boxes built by Jeff Hunt and Andrew Styblo of our Board of Trustees. We have four units placed throughout the sanctuary, allowing us to safely close the windows for the remainder of the winter.

The following is a reminder of how you can do your part to protect your church family at in-person worship:

- 1. Pre-register for the service on our website, www.woodburyumc.net.
- 2. Upgrade your mask to at least a surgical mask. We strongly encourage you to wear an N/KN 95 mask for increased protection. Both will be available to anyone who needs one at check-in.
- 3. If you or a family member is ill, please stay home and continue to enjoy the service online at our website, <u>www.woodburyumc.net</u>, or our YouTube channel at <u>http://www.youtube.com/channel/UCN-kkokTCbVE9urwgP_AEcw</u>.
- 4. Maintain your distance from other family units after briefly greeting one another.

From Woodbury to Ecuador and Back Again – Love in Action

In 2017 the WUMC began a relationship with the people and the Methodist Church in Ecuador through a connection with Sara Flores and her husband Dakin Cook, missionaries with the General Board of Global Ministries (GBGM). The church has supported ministry with the people of Ecuador through prayer, financial gifts to GBGM ministries (Advance Specials in Methodist lingo), sale of handcrafted items with proceeds going directly to Sara for discretionary use there or Advance Specials, and in 2018 a mission team of 12 (most of whom were from the WUMC) spent a week of service in churches in Atucucho and El Prado in Ecuador. But the love and service are not one way. In addition to the hospitality and the care our mission team received while in Ecuador, on several occasions over the past 5 years we have been the recipients of heartfelt prayer from the churches in Ecuador. The last time being on the 20th anniversary of September 11th.

With this ongoing mutual commitment to share the love of Christ between the one body in two locations in mind the **Mission & Outreach Committee will be receiving a special offering throughout the season of Lent** to provide continuing support of the ministries of Sara Flores and the Methodist Churches in Ecuador. While the needs in Ecuador are varied, which include programs for children, support for pastors, and just recently recovery from flood damage at the end of January, Sara has asked that the gifts we raise go towards the building of a church and community center for El Prado and surrounding communities. Sara writes, "To achieve this dream, we are in a campaign to promote funds for the purchase of land. The goal is to reach \$20,000 U.S., and we have already saved \$5,000. We pray, confident that we can achieve this goal in 2022. We invite Woodbury UMC to be part of this dream."

Each Sunday in Lent there will be well-marked locations in the church where a gift can be left. Gifts can also be mailed to the church or donations can be made through the church's website. If a check is written please make it out to "WUMC" with "Ecuador" on the memo line.

Lent is traditionally a time when people give something up. This Lent may we also take up this way of deepening our Methodist worldwide connection.
