

*Note – Safe Sanctuary policies will be reviewed & reflect this new method of programming. For example; common guidelines for basic safety for online meetings with children & youth include meeting with 2 approved youth leaders minimum. No youth should be communicating 1 on 1 with church adults without a parent's name on file. For a virtual online meeting, youth should be located in "family" space of house with parent near & parent should occasionally pop into view to give leaders a wave. Online safety and etiquette should be discussed with the teen & parent prior to online meeting.


