## Congregation surprises pastor on his birthday

WOODBURY — Pastor John Thomason was at home preparing his 72nd birthday dinner Tuesday evening when the horns started honking.

He went outside to find members of his Woodbury United Methodist Church congregation and other friends parading down Church Street with balloons, signs and well wishes, all in salute of the man they say helped turn their church around.

"I was grilling chicken in the back yard and all of a sudden I hear this insistent car honking and I absolutely had no idea what it was," Thomason said. "I was blown away. It was unexpected and much appreciated."


These days, large birthday celebrations and in-person church services are rare, so church office manager Kathy Craig organized the caravan as a way to say thanks, social-distance style.

Church bylaws mandate fulltime pastors retire at age 72, meaning this will be Thomason's final year in Woodbury. Those who know him say they wish he could stay forever.

"It's the love we all have for him. Not only is it that we are losing him next year, but the church was in turmoil when he first came seven years ago and he has helped turn things around with the passion he brings for people," Craig said.

Upon his arrival in 2013,

Upon his arrival in 2013, Thomason promised his congregation that he would be there for them and treat them as his own family. And, according to the church's Board of Trustees Chairman Theron Kissinger, he has fulfilled that promise, always there with sage advice and compas-

sion, furthering the WUMC's mission statement that "love is spoken here."

Thomason has spent his days in Woodbury immersing himself in the lives of his congregation, attending youth sporting events, visiting people in the hospital and offering a light in times of darkness, including during the current COVID-19 crisis.

"To many, he is more than a pastor or a friend. He's like a father or a brother," Kissinger said. "My parents live in New Mexico, so he at times has been like a surrogate father to me and for many others."

And Thomason admits the pandemic has created challenges for the church, which like so many other churches across the country, has struggled to maintain a solid base of members. Kissinger says Thomason's stewardship goes beyond sheer numbers and that his presence and

compassion has brought an unprecedented level of "spiritualness and community."

Joining Tuesday's birthday carayan were Woodbury First Selectman Barbara Perkinson, fellow clergy members from around town, and Bob Taylor of the Woodbury Food Bank, where Thomason has spent hundreds of hours volunteering his time.

"Pastor John has been a tremendous help to the Woodbury Food Bank over the years," Taylor said. "He has always shown a tremendous caring and empathy for all the folks we serve and I consider him a good friend."

The pastor, a native of Texas, has 44 years of ministry experience and says leadership is something to be shared by all.

Thomason has two daughters, Kate and Beth, and a grandson Allen, who was by his grandfather's side as the parade passed on by.
