Will you walk in this year's **7th Annual Harvest Walk To End Hunger** sponsored by Southbury-Woodbury Interfaith Ministries? In years past it was primarily our WUMC youth group walking. This year SWIM has proposed a friendly competition between faith communities to see who can bring out the most people. Larger numbers make us more visible to the town, creating greaterawareness of a serious issue of hunger affecting even our communities.

This year's Walk will be held on September 15 at 1:00 pm starting at Mitchell Elementary School in Woodbury to coincide with Hunger Action Awareness Month. The cost is \$10 per person. (If you would like to participate, but cannot pay, you may still walk with us.)
