# Worship Moves into the Sanctuary Starting This Sunday, 10:30 AM

After meeting outdoors on the North Green since mid-July, our worship service will move indoors for the cold weather months beginning this Sunday, October 4. We will resume our regular starting time of 10:30 AM.

Please see the September 30 "Life of the Church" article written by Lay Leader *Mark Davis* and *Pastor John* for reminders about protocols to be followed for indoor worship. The sanctuary has been deep-cleaned and sanitized, and the best possible procedures for ventilation will be implemented.

Please note: There will be no Zoom Fellowship Hour during the period when we are worshiping outdoors.


## Fall Women's Study 2020
