MISSION & OUTREACH CHRISTMAS GIVING OPPORTUNITIES

Yes, we are only half way through November and we're talking about Christmas. If you have been able to go to a store in the last couple of weeks you'd know that Christmas marketing is in full swing. And some of our local social service agencies are starting to get their Christmas giving programs going. Two that we would like to support this year are **Caring for Bethlehem** and **Woodbury Community Services Council.**

Caring for Bethlehem is similar to Woodbury Community Services, but their Christmas giving program is serviced through the public school. This means that families serviced are from both Bethlehem and Woodbury (since there are some Woodbury students who go to Bethlehem Elementary School). **Caring for Bethlehem** is sponsoring a **Holiday Gift Tree** which is located at the True Value Hardware Store in Bethlehem (right on Rte 61 in the middle of town). The **Holiday Gift Tree** works this way:

- 1. Pick a card from the Gift Tree at True Value. (The Gift Tree is currently ready and waiting)
- 2. Purchase the gift.
- 3. Deliver the gift with the card attached to True Value by December 12th.
- 4. Your gift will be delivered to a family in time for the holidays.
- 5. Share the Joy!

Woodbury Community Services Council is sponsoring **Santa's Workshop** and is looking for help in providing gifts for children ages birth to 18 years. The following items are requested and can be brought to the church anytime between now and December 6th (A box for donated items will be available in the entry way between the sanctuary and the office.):


Mission Statement of the Woodbury United Methodist Church
