Lent

Lent is a 40-day season of spiritual preparation for Easter, beginning on Ash Wednesday and ending on Holy Saturday. The number of days in Lent recalls Christ's temptation in the wilderness, which lasted forty days. Because Sundays are always "little Easters," the Sundays in Lent are considered feast days rather than fast days and are not included in the forty days.

The term *Lent* comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *lencten,* which means "spring." Historically, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by converts and then became a time of heightened spiritual discipline for all Christians.

This year, WUMC'S Lenten journey will focus on the end-point of Christ's earthly journey – the cross – where he uttered 7 last "words." Adam Hamilton's book/video series, *Final Words from the Cross*, will serve as our guide. Pastor John will preach a Lenten sermon series highlighting each of the words in their traditional order. The adult Bible Study Fellowship will explore the corresponding chapter in Hamilton's book each Tuesday night in Lent (see below).



MISSION ECUADOR

Support for the Methodist Church's mission and ministry in Ecuador is one of the four core areas that our Mission and Outreach team prioritized for the mission focus of the Woodbury United Methodist Church. Our main vehicle for supporting ministry in Ecuador is through the United Methodist Church's Board of Global Ministries missionary assigned to Ecuador: *Sara Flores* and her husband *Dakin Cook*. Below is a recent email received from Sara & Dakin sharing the situation in Ecuador. Please take a moment to read this and then I would like to share one way that we can continue to support the churches and people of Ecuador.

Dear friends.

Greetings from Quito, praying that you are well and healthy.

We want to share good news, recently UMC Global Ministries approved my mission assignment (Sara) to Ecuador for 3 more years. Please keep us in your prayers. Mission service for us is a blessing and amid this time of general crisis, we pray that God can strengthen the mission in Ecuador.

We need to share that the situation of the pandemic in Ecuador is very bad. Vaccination is just getting started here, last week the first shipment arrived for frontline health workers and we expect more over the next month. We really don't expect a good proportion of the population to be vaccinated here until late this year, if then. Ecuador and the region continue to have a high death and contagion rates and it is not yet leveling off and really won't for a good while. We are still under various restrictions regarding vehicle circulation, restaurant occupancy, limits on gatherings and others, and these were just increased (again) in January-February.

As for visiting Ecuador, the restrictions and the risks would really affect the logistics for the groups. Although the visitor teams could all be vaccinated and have negative PCR tests, as required by USA and Ecuador, this would not avoid a risk for the teams and the local population. It is really too early for us to be able to say when it might be safe to come; even though we would really like to receive Volunteer In Mission Teams this year, with the Bishop and Church leaders, we think that the best option is to postpone all visits to 2022.

The churches, all friends here miss you, and to continue together in mission for this year we will plan virtual mission visits and work; we would like to invite you to be part of this effort. Even when we are far from each other, we can share, pray, praise, and have Bible studies together. We would like you to be able to maintain organizing and planning as a group and we will be able to plan shared activities via zoom or videos, possibly on the same dates that would have planned your trip. For churches in Ecuador, it would be a blessing to stay in touch even virtually.

Our hope is that over the next months we will be able to see major improvements in governments actions to save lives and achieve greater equity in vaccine distribution in the world. In addition to the health crisis, the economic crisis continues to have a strong impact on the lives of families, without jobs and without enough food this is a very difficult situation for many families. The Church is still in mission; although most churches in the cities continue their activities virtually, some churches outside of the cities have Sunday Services with restrictions and biosecurity. We all continue to focus on spiritual, emotional and health accompaniment, looking for ways to meet the needs of pastors and communities.

In such difficult times, we thank God for the contribution of your Church for Pastoral Salary Support, Construction, or support for Children's Ministries. You are part of God's Mission in Ecuador.

Every day at 3pm from home, all the Ecuadorian churches remain in a prayer chain. Our world needs this unity in prayer and spirit. We hope that you feel blessed, as daily, many friends remember you and pray for you.


HOUSEKEEPING NOTES FROM THE OFFICE...
