May 3: Fourth Sunday of Easter, 10:30 am Sacrament of Holy Communion

Note you will need to enable your camera and perhaps audio, depending on your default Zoom or device settings. On most devices, the meeting controls are located at the lower-left corner of the Zoom window. If meeting controls are not visible, move cursor over or click on the Zoom window on your PC or tap your icon (video or placeholder) on your phone. Note you can configure your device to view speaker video, mosaic of multiple meeting participants, etc.

Due to Zoom restrictions for free accounts, the Zoom meeting must be concluded by noon and currently audio only call in by telephone is not available.

Wednesday's remote fellowship will continue to be held by phone at 7:30 PM (call in #: 203-633-3808, no PIN required).

WUMC members and friends are invited to use this forum to stay in touch, pray together, express joys/concerns, ask questions, and seek assistance.
