May 24, 10:30 am Seventh Sunday of Easter Ascension Sunday

Ascension Day is the 40th day after Easter when Christ ascended into heaven (Acts 1:1-11). Our observance will be held on the Sunday after Ascension Day. At the end of the worship hour, the Paschal Candle will be taken out of the sanctuary, symbolizing the light of Christ becoming available to the whole world through his ascension.

May 24 is also the Sunday before **Memorial Day** on the nation's calendar. *Kate Keeler* will sing "America the Beautiful" as a Prelude, and *Chris Shay* will play an arrangement of the "Navy Hymn" ("Eternal Father, Strong to Save") as the Postlude.

On the 7th **Sunday of Easter**, *Joann King* will serve as liturgist; *Mary Grace* and *Elizabeth Styblo* will lead the Children's Time, with *Andrew* serving as cameraman. A collage of singers will lead hymns and present an anthem.


