"Spread the Light" - A Message from the Community Services Council of Woodbury

The Community Services Council of Woodbury will mark the 11th anniversary of our annual "**Spread the Light**" fundraising campaign during June with an invitation to all who have sustained and strengthened our mission during the pandemic journey to join us in dedicating this year's appeal as "**A Celebration of Gratitude and Hope.**" From Memorial Day through the Fourth of July, donors who make a "Spread the Light" donation to the CSCW by mail, online or in person at the Woodbury Food Bank are invited to pick up both a star lantern and a gratitude stone as symbols of their shared partnership in the Council's daily work to assist Woodbury neighbors in need. In keeping with an annual tradition that began in 2011, approximately 200 star lanterns will be placed on trees at Woodbury's five town greens along Main Street on the Fourth of July. Each star lantern, displayed throughout the day and illuminated during the evening, will represent a dedication made through a donation to the "Spread the Light" campaign.

Donors will have the opportunity to pick up a star lantern and a "gratitude stone" at the "Spread the Light" table outside the Woodbury Food Bank from June 2 through July 3 on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 9 a.m. to noon, on Fridays from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m., and on Saturdays from 9 to 11 a.m. We very much hope that the community will embrace this year's theme of thanksgiving and hope by displaying gratitude stones and star lanterns widely at their own homes. At a time when we all have so much to be thankful for, what a beautiful message we can send by letting our stars shine and creating our own gratitude stones! Donations may be made in person at the food bank, or by mailing a check payable to "Community Services Council" to the CSCW, PO Box 585, Woodbury, CT 06798. The CSCW also offers the option to make "Spread the Light" donations through the PayPal portal available on the CSCW web page on the Town of Woodbury website. This page can be reached by using the URL, https://woodburyct.org, to reach the Town of Woodbury home page, and then using the "Community Links" tab to access the

Community Services Council of Woodbury page on the town website.

Donors are invited to include memorial or honorary dedications to persons they wish to remember by submitting a written note of these names with their in-person or mail donations, or by including these names in the PayPal "Write a note" box. Dedications also may be submitted to the attention of CSCW president Bob Taylor by email at <u>community.services.council@gmail.com</u>. In sharing the story of our work at the CSCW, I have often returned to the theme of "Spread the Light" as a powerful reminder that, when each of us lights our own small candle, together we can banish the deepest darkness. I celebrate all our friends whose candles burn so brightly and light the path ahead.
