SUBJECT: An Appeal from Bishop Bickerton for Victims of the St. Vincent Volcano

Dear Friends & Colleagues,

Disaster Response has long been a significant and integral part of the New York Annual Conference mission portfolio. Disasters are frequent and always unpredictable. Over the past five years, NYAC volunteers, resources, and personnel expertise have supported disaster response efforts in Texas, Florida, Haiti, Mozambique, Saipan, Puerto Rico, and the Bahamas. Together, with the United Methodist Committee on Relief, United Methodist Volunteers in Mission, and other United Methodist organizations, we have played a critical role in responding to both the immediate aftermath and long-term recovery efforts that have touched individuals and communities throughout the world.

I am writing to you today because we are once again being called upon to provide support where it is needed most. Last month, the La Soufrière volcano on the Caribbean island of St. Vincent began a series of explosive eruptions sending clouds of hot ash some 20,000 feet into the air, covering much of the island in ash, blanketing farmland, and contaminating local water reservoirs. Thousands of people are without homes and reports are that many parts of the island are unrecognizable. Heavy rains are now causing landslides. There are possibilities that eruptions may continue for the coming weeks. In addition, spikes in COVID cases are being seen in shelters.

Earlier this month, I spoke with Bishop Derick Richards, Episcopal leader of the South Caribbean District. Present on that call were Reverends Patrick Perrin and Wesley Daniel of the NYAC Caribbean Mission Partnership, and Rev. Tom Vencuss, NYAC Director of Missions and Disaster Response. Bishop Richards provided an update on the situation, the effects of the eruption on his family, local needs, and the work that the Church is doing in response. It saddened my heart to hear the depth of despair and need among our sisters and brothers in St. Vincent.

We have several of our New York Annual Conference leaders who are responding in real time:

- Rev. Gordon Edwards is engaging NYAC clergy specializing in counseling and Disaster Emotional and Spiritual to provide virtual training and workshops for local clergy.
- Rev. Tom Vencuss is meeting with a St Vincent task force as they develop their long-term recovery plans.
- Revs. Patrick Perrin, Wesley Daniel, and the Caribbean Mission Partnership will be serving
 as liaisons between St. Vincent and the NYAC. They will provide me and the Annual
 Conference with regular updates.
- We are also supporting New York Congresswoman, the Honorable Yvette Clarke, and her call
 for the US State Department to immediately provide Temporary Protected Status to people
 evacuated from the Red Zone on the island of St. Vincent and the Grenadines.

These are committed and compassionate responses. Still, there is more that we can do. At my request, the NYAC Missions office has established a dedicated restricted account to receive funds. I am asking each local church in our Annual Conference to consider receiving special offerings for the St. Vincent volcano recovery effort. Checks may be sent to:

Given the significant Caribbean presence within our Annual Conference, there are many in our midst who are directly and emotionally effected by this disaster. This alone should make any response we offer, one that touches our hearts with compassion and care. As I Corinthians 12:26 says so simply and eloquently, "If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it."

No one knows better than I that the times in which we live are difficult. Still, I hope that we can once again respond to our brothers and sisters in need as we have in the past.

Search your hearts with me and please respond as you can. For that, I will be truly grateful. The Journey Continues, . . .
