The Season after Pentecost, also called Ordinary Time, begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent. **Trinity Sunday** is always observed on the First Sunday after Pentecost, a celebration of the triune God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Peace with Justice Sunday is also observed on the First Sunday after Pentecost in the United Methodist Church. This day witnesses to God's demand for a faithful, just, peaceful, and secure world. The special

offering received on this occasion funds peace with justice ministries provided by annual conferences and the General Board of Church and Society. Those wishing to donate may do so through the WUMC website or by writing a check to WUMC with "Peace with Justice Sunday" in the memo.

On June 7, Rynn Naylor will serve as liturgist and Communion co-celebrant; Diane and Rebecca Hibbard will lead the Children's Time; the Cloud family will lead hymn singing; and Barbara & Jeff Hunt and Kate Keeler will provide special music.
