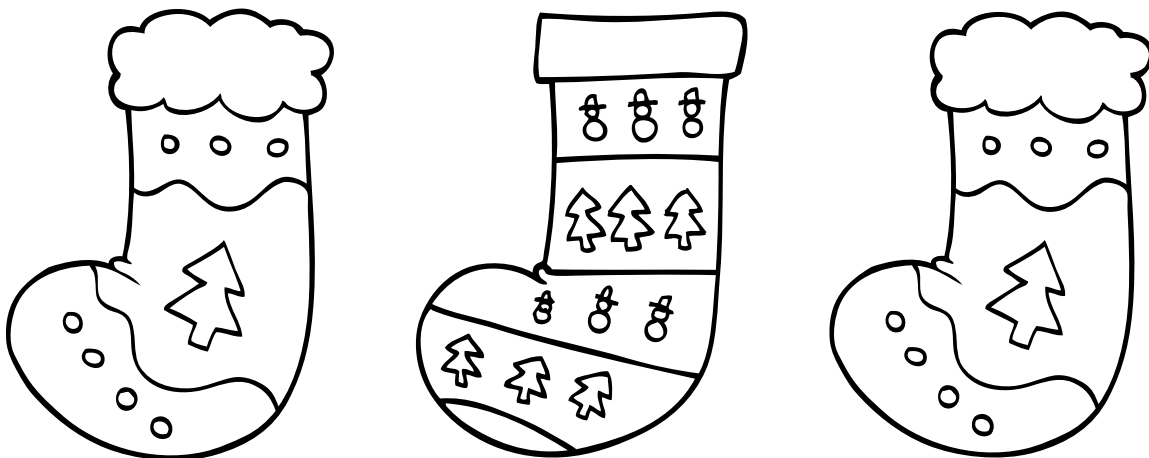
## Fun Facts About the Pagan Origins of Christmas Traditions

Many Christmas traditions began with pagans. Here are three common traditions that pagans started:

**Kissing Under the Mistletoe**- the tradition of kissing under the mistletoe started as a fertility ritual. Most of the pagan rituals were for honoring gods in hopes that they would be able to have children and bountiful crops.

**Gift Giving**- early pagans gave small gifts to each other at Yule in the hopes that it would bring them an abundant year. Instead of giving a gift to everyone, they each gave one gift to one person.

**Hanging Stockings**- Every year, Odin would ride around the world on his eight-legged horse, Sleipnir during the Wild Hunt at Yule. Children would put treats for Odin's horse in their shoes, and Odin would reward them with a gift.
