NSWVGA 54 HOLES STROKE PLAY CHAMPIONSHIPS

The tournament, in its 27th year, was played in wet conditions at Richmond, Glenmore Heritage Valley and Stonecutters Ridge. The tournament was reduced to 36 holes after day 1 at Richmond was washed out. A capacity field entered the tournament which was won by John Osborn (Mudgee) by one stroke from Geoff Cranfield (Long Reef) and last year's champion Ricky

Allison (Camden Lakeside) in third place. John's rounds were 73 and 75 (148). Nett winner was Matt Kumjew (Hurstville) with a nett score of 138.

Once again, the tournament was an outstanding success with 54 Golf Club represented, including entries from Interstate and one entry from the U.K. The tournament received high praise from all quarters involved.

WSRVGA will again host this event in 2020 when it will be played at Richmond, Dunheved and Stonecutters Ridge golf courses. In 2020 NSWVGA will put the hosting rights for the following three years out to tender
