A **knight** was a professional cavalry soldier (meaning they rode on horseback) in Europe in the Middle Ages, which was about 500 years ago. Knights were the best soldiers in the kingdom, who fought for lords or nobles, and sometimes got land in return. They thought honour was very important, and they had a code of honour called chivalry. A knight usually had a coat of arms, also called an armorial achievement. Knights were first used in the 8th century in the late Roman armies. The era of the knights lasted until the 16th century. After that, national armies replaced feudal armies. Many knights were recruited as officers in the new armies.

A **dragon** is a legendary creature that appears in the folklore of multiple cultures worldwide. Beliefs about dragons vary considerably through regions, but dragons in Western cultures since the High Middle Ages have often been depicted as winged, horned, and capable of breathing fire. Dragons in eastern cultures are usually depicted as wingless, four-legged, serpentine creatures with above-average intelligence. Similarities between dragons' traits are often a combination of cat, reptile, and bird features. Scholars believe large extinct or migrating crocodiles bear the closest resemblance, especially when encountered in forested or swampy areas, and are most likely the template of modern Asian dragon imagery. Dragon-like creatures appear in virtually all cultures around the globe and the earliest reports of dracon-like creatures resemble giant snakes. Some experts think comets and meteors streaking across the night sky inspired the belief that they flew and breathed fire.
