ABOUT THE GLOBAL AUTISM CONVENTION (GAC)

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The Global Autism Convention is a collaborative platform that brings together clinicians, educators, families, self-advocates, and policy leaders to explore autism through a lens of neurodiversity, equity, and cultural relevance, especially in low and middle-income countries (LMICs).

The 1st GAC was held from May 19–21, 2011 at the NIMHANS Convention Centre, Bengaluru. It was jointly organised by the Rotary Club Bangalore West, ASHA, St. John's Medical College Hospital, and other autism-related organisations. It highlighted ground-level interventions and led to the proposal of a national autism professionals' network.

The 2nd GAC was conceptualized and led by Dr. M.V. Ashok, the founding Head of the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Unit and CAREADD at St. John's Medical College Hospital in 2018. It marked a landmark moment for inclusive, community-rooted autism dialogue in India, bringing together national and international voices to center lived experiences and collaborative care.

ROOTED IN VISION, COMMITTED TO CARE



CENTRE FOR ADVANCED RESEARCH AND EXCELLENCE IN AUTISM AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISORDERS (CAREADD)



CAREADD at St. John's Medical College Hospital was envisioned by Dr. M.V. Ashok to provide holistic, culturally sensitive care for children, adolescents, and adults on the autism spectrum. It offers diagnostic assessments, early intervention, parent-mediated programs, life skills training, and support for co-occurring conditions. CAREADD is closely linked to the COMDEALL Early Intervention Centre and serves one of the largest cohorts of autistic children and youth in the region, combining clinical care with research and community engagement.

CHILD & ADOLESCENT PSYCHIATRY UNIT, DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHIATRY, SJMCH



The Child and Adolescent Psychiatry Unit, established in 1994 by Dr. M.V. Ashok, delivers comprehensive mental health services for children and adolescents. It runs outpatient and inpatient care, and specialized clinics for autism, adolescent health, trauma, and eating disorders. The unit offers an RGUHS-recognized Post-Doctoral Fellowship in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry and trains students across disciplines. Its work integrates clinical care, academic training, and policy-driven research, reflecting a long-standing commitment to inclusive and developmentally informed mental health services.


