From all of us at Feed Scarborough, thank you Susan for sharing your amazing talent with us.

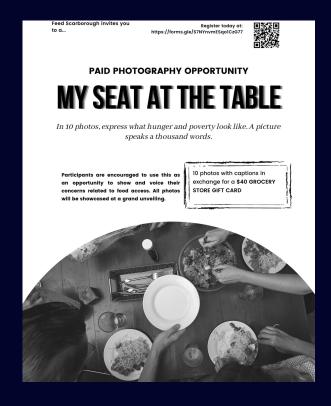
VACCINATION UPDATE

Over the summer of 2021, Scarborough Food Security Initiative has partnered with local community organizations to help bring more awareness about Vaccinations and COVID-19. Our Outreach Vaccine Ambassador Team has been working with Toronto Public Health to target specific locations in South Scarborough with lower vaccine rates. The team led Information Booths and Pop-Up Clinics within the Oakridge region, where we targeted buildings in Teesdale, Warden Ave, and Fir Valley. The pop-up clinics and engagements were a success, with an overall increase of vaccinations by approximately 100 vaccinations, most being first doses. We look forward to future initiatives in the community, to help eliminate the spread of COVID-19 together.
