


### Member Spotlight

## Jane Bradley, Wonderful Artist!

"Since I first picked up a paint brush at fourteen years old, I have reveled in color. Simple line drawings of people and horses now took on shades of meaning and emotion. Second only to color is my love of rendering the human form. There is a whole world to be discovered in a face, in a gesture, the subtle turn of a hand. This is my frontier, something for which I never get tired of exploring. My enthusiasm spills over into my teaching and I try to bring people along on this adventure."






"I received my MFA at the University of Utah in painting and computer animation in 1991. The twelve years that followed were devoted to my work as a computer animator and eventually as an Art Director for major console and computer game companies. In those twelve years I spent a great deal of time not only with 3d computer building and animating, but also in becoming an expert in texture mapping - using photoshop and graphic design. During that time, I occasionally had done portraits, but for the most part my painting had been set aside for my career. In 2004, I decided to return to painting full time and to teaching both at the community colleges and privately."






#### Spotlight of the Month, Jane Bradley Continued

"Since 2004 I have done numerous shows, and hung in galleries. I sold work at the CM Russel Auction, the Scottsdale Salon of Art and the Phippen Museum Western Art Show and Sale for which I won the 2006 Best of Show for my painting "Red Shoes". I have chosen in the last few years to do fewer shows and instead concentrate on commissions and portraiture. In 2017 I was awarded Best of Show for my painting "Professor of Hip-Hop" in the yearly Portrait Artist of Arizona competition. The next two years I won Best of Show in the Gilbert Art League. I have been selected to participate in several national shows with the Women Artists of the West and American Women Artists and have won first place on two online shows with the Women Artists of the West. I am an Associate member with Distinction of the American Women Artists, a member of the Oil Painters of America, the Portrait Society of America, the Portrait Artists of Arizona and the Women Artists of the West."







#### Patricia Book, Artist of the Month for June

I added the large agave plant since I had taken a photo of one on the way to Globe. There are not any agaves in the original picture or in that part of the desert! Acrylics present challenges that I don't find with porcelain - they dry so quickly that the skies are most difficult for me. I have painted cats in acrylics and scenes are much more challenging - especially the mid-ground. I am not as happy with the flowers in this picture because they are so much easier to paint on porcelain where I can wipe them off and start over! But I was happy with the way this picture turned out. Many of my photos are taken when my husband and I go rock crawling. I have so many pictures I want to paint and so much to paint and so little time to complete all the projects I begin! Painting takes you outside of yourself and the finished piece gives pleasure – I am my own worst critic and can always see things that are not perfect. I love painting so it is great to be able to continue with new challenges.

Thanks to Pat Book who demonstrated Lusters and Water Lilies on Zoom after winning the scholarship for her porcelain class. I hope you enjoyed the different porcelain techniques used in my class!







To Join in a Zoom meeting, your computer must have Video (a camera) and Audio (speakers and a microphone). If you do not have a computer with these capabilities, you can join by phone by simply calling into the phone number in the email and following the prompts.

See the document below with Zoom instructions and the portion titled "Join By Using a Phone."

#### **ZOOM INSTRUCTIONS!**

You will receive an invitation in your email with a link to join the Zoom meeting.

- 1. When you click on this link, the first thing you will see is a web page open with a little box that says, "Open Zoom Meetings?" Click on "Open Zoom Meetings" bubble at the bottom right
- 2. Next you will see another box open up with a smaller box in front with a video feed of yourself. Maximize this screen and click on "Join with Video"
- 3. A window will open to the meeting and you will see all of the participants in little picture squares, (similar to the TV show Hollywood Squares).
- 4. Underneath your video feed, there is a black bar with a menu (on some computers you will have to scroll down with your mouse for it to appear).
- a. On this menu you have the ability to mute or unmute yourself by clicking on the first icon (a picture of a microphone, if it has a red slash you are muted no one can hear you).
- b. If you click on the Participants icon, a white column will open up on the right side of your screen. This is where you can see all the people in the meeting. At the bottom of this column, you will see the options to click on "unmute me" or "Raise Your Hand". These are requests for the Host of the meeting. If you click on Raise Your Hand it will put a little green hand in the upper left corner of your video feed. This lets the Host know that you would like to speak.
- c. When you click on the Chat Icon, a little box will appear at the bottom of the white column. You have the option to send a private message to someone in the meeting or you can type a message that will post in the column for everyone to see.
- d. The last icon is "Reactions". When you click on this icon you can respond to something someone is saying by either clapping or giving a thumbs up.
- 5. During Zoom meetings, You Should keep yourself muted until it is time for you to share or the Host calls on you. This helps reduce the background noise in your area so that others can hear what is being said.

- 6. During Zoom meetings, you should adjust your camera so that your face is at the center of the screen. It is very annoying for others to see only the top of one's head or the bottom portion of one's body.
- 7. You can leave the meeting at any time by clicking on the Red Letters at the bottom right of the black Menu bar and then clicking on the little white box that appears asking you to confirm you want to leave the meeting.

## Joining a meeting by phone only

1. Dial an in-country number. If you dial a toll number, your carrier rates will apply. You can find the numbers on your meeting invitation or a full list of international dial-in numbers at

https://zoom.us/zoomconference.

- 2. You will be prompted to enter the meeting ID the nine (9), ten (10), or eleven (11) digit ID provided to you by the host, followed by #
- 3. If the meeting has not already started and join before host is not enabled, you will be prompted to enter the host key to start the meeting, or to press # to wait if you are participant.
- 4. You will be prompted to enter your unique participant ID. This only applies if you have joined on the computer or mobile device or are a panelist in a webinar. Press # to skip.

If you join by computer or mobile device later, you can enter the Participant ID to bind your phone and device session together and show your video when you speak on the phone. To enter your participant ID once you are in the meeting, enter #Participant ID# on your phone.

#### Phone controls for participants

The following commands can be entered via DTMF tones using your phone's dial pad while in a Zoom meeting:

- · \*6 Toggle mute/unmute
- · \*9 Raise hand
