## PHOTOGRAPHING YOUR ARTWORK

When it comes to photographing artwork, many artists think they can simply snap a picture and be done. While this method gets an image that can be used to simply *remember* what the artwork looked like, it won't do for other purposes.

The first thing an artist should do is decide the *purpose* for the photograph. Is it to simply remember the painting or sculpture? Is it to make entries into shows, exhibits, and contests? Or is it to make prints, saleable prints, of the artwork in order to provide more income from one piece of art? Each of these three purposes requires different tools, different settings, and different finishes. Probably the best thing to do is to plan on making an image for prints, then using that one image to provide both of the other needs.

There are three stages to getting a quality image. The first is choosing the right tools and location. The second is getting the correct shot. And the third is finishing the image correctly. At the October MAL meeting, we will address the second step – getting the correct shot. This will be a hands-on activity where artists will work on their own artwork to get a correct shot. And, if there is time, we will go on to the third step – finishing the image.

In order to obtain a proper image, the artist needs proper tools. Obviously, one needs a camera with a telephoto lens (and that might NOT be your cell phone!). One also needs a tripod or some way of stabilizing the camera. One very important consideration is where to put the artwork to be photographed. If it's wall art, it needs to be *unframed* and *unglazed*. If you work in oils and are accustomed to varnishing your work, make your image before applying the varnish. But most important is the matter of LIGHT. Photography

work is all about capturing light. Direct lighting is really bad because it causes glare on the artwork. That lets out using the flash on the camera. All light has color, and that color will affect the resulting image. Sunlight is considered colorless light, but only at midday. But it is also direct light, so cannot be used. Morning and evening light have definite color shifts to orange and red, and that will affect the resulting look of the artwork. Sunlight in a shaded area will have a blue tone. Incandescent light glows yellow. Fluorescent lighting casts a green glow. The human eye is adjusted for these tints by the brain. But the camera has no brain. The preferred lighting is indirect, natural light (not shining directly on the artwork). Usually this means that uncolored sunlight (not early morning or late afternoon) enters the room fully but does not fall directly on the artwork.

Now we must also consider the room. What color are the walls? If light is bouncing around in a room painted blue, the light will pick up that blue and add it to the artwork being photographed. Also, what color are the curtains, and do they have a pattern? Photographing with light that comes through patterned curtains can create strange patterns onto the artwork. Another consideration is the actual size of the room. Since you will want to shoot at about the midpoint on your telephoto lens, you may have to back away from the artwork. The best plan is to be 10 to 15 feet away from the artwork and zoom in to it.

The next thing to be considered is how to present the artwork. If it is wall art, it should be hung at a level that allows the camera to "see" it without tilting, either up or down or left to right. The artwork must be hung absolutely straight and flat against the wall. A small level applied to the sides of the artwork should determine this.

Setting the camera is part of step 2 of this process. This will be covered at the demo.

Once the image has been obtained, it must be finished. This requires a computer with some

sort of imaging software. Photoshop or Photoshop Elements are the two big names in the industry. However, they are quite expensive. If you're working on a MAC, Pixelmator might be an option. GIMP is a free program that does everything Photoshop does, but it takes a while to learn. If you have Windows 10, you probably have imaging software on your computer already such as Microsoft Photo or Microsoft Paint. In Pixio is a free program that should do everything you will need to do, should you not have one already installed. FastStone is also a free program that should do everything needed. Paint.net is a free download from their website. For MACs, Apple Photo may be a good choice.

Finishing will include cropping out anything that is not the artwork (3-D artists find this to be a challenge), adjusting color and density to match the original, then saving the image and naming it according to what is required. Most artists end up with multiple versions of each image of differing sizes.

At our October meeting we will pursue Step 2, which is getting the image. We will do this at 3 PM **before** the meeting in order to take advantage of the natural daylight in the room. We will provide "walls" for hanging artwork. In order to participate, artists should bring in a painting, their camera, and their computer with imaging software installed. Watercolorists may "hang" their artwork on existing walls with tape. Watercolor art should be brought in its "raw" state – unmounted and unframed. Works on canvas should have hanging wire (stretched VERY tight) or gator hooks installed. Actually, gator hooks work best for the hanging system we will be using. Three-D artists may use available tables but should bring in a drop cloth for background.

Participants should be familiar with their camera settings and with their computer programs. The camera should have a medium telephoto lens attached. We will be using available light from the overhead windows, which may not be perfect, but will be better than electric lighting. We will plan to spend about 1.5 hours actually working on getting the image and then making it correctly finished!


