We have some exciting news about the OneOhOne Gallery. Meri with the Cartel is having her opening on August 15th from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. There will be a ribbon cutting, media, snacks and refreshments, artist demonstrations and the mayor might be there to celebrate the opening. We are so excited to have her open her studio. She will be selling memberships for \$55 a month and \$15 for a 1 day drop in. She will have loads of supplies available to use for that fee as well as space and input for all of your art needs.

Because of the changes at the gallery, our studio there will be busier than it has been before. There are a few openings for the upcoming months. We have 2 different ways to have your art in the MAL studio. You can be the "Featured Artist" where you hang your art on the big wall in the studio. We also have 1/2 walls available for \$50 a month. You can hang your art there for up to 3 months. We have more openings for these 1/2 walls. 

Workshop Description

I demonstrate in my paintings as primarily western landscapes which may include centers of interest such as people, animals, flowers, man-made shapes,

and nature objects.

I think I am primarily a creator of watercolor possibilities. In the cooler fall and winter seasons I prefer plein air, (on location painting), for the source

of my ideas.

An outline of subjects to be explored in studio is based on outdoor experiences, reference photos and sketches, also included is painting and materials

for transparent watercolor; the painting plan, value sketch, paper wet or dry, painting approaches: light, medium, dark, as well as large, medium, small shapes.

A typical day in transparent watercolor studio.

You are invited to bring your ideas for watercolor painting, as well as a painting or sketch you have done and would like to share and talk about it.

Sometimes I will demonstrate mini sketches to show application of materials and subject matter to show possibilities. Reference photos are available to the class for exploration if needed.

Afternoon, everybody paints, I will be around to answer and help each one as needed. Critique to end the day, show and tell.
