

Fawn Wood

Born into the respected multi-generational traditional singing Wood family, Fawn Wood's singing reflects her Cree and Salish tribal lineage. At an early age Fawn would sing her heart out at pow-wows alongside her mother and father. In 2006, Fawn was the first female to win the Hand Drum contest at the Gathering of Nations Pow Wow. In 2009 she opened the show at the 11th Annual Native American Music Awards (NAMMYS). In 2010 she also sang with her partner, Dallas Waskahat for the opening of the Aboriginal People's Choice Music Awards in Winnipeg, Manitoba.



Logan Staats

Logan Staats is a Mohawk singer-songwriter and musician from Six Nations of the Grand River. Staats achieved mainstream success throughout 2018, and in 2019, off his win on the first season of CTV's The Launch. He is best known for his single, "The Lucky Ones" which hit number one on the Canadian iTunes chart right after its release. He also appeared in the 2017 Canadian documentary, When They Awake, which celebrates Indigenous artists and their communities.



SLUG

SLUG is a punk three piece with two bassists and one brain cell from Toronto. Originally born and raised in Sioux Lookout, Ontario Nicky is that very brain cell and Oji-Cree/Italian woman that writes songs about hating that guy, dogs, being a 1000-year-old giant monster destroying your city and collective trauma and oppression built by colonialism and capitalism (in a fun way). On drums Michele keeps this lil slug-head consistent while rotating lead bassist Anna & Big Dee act as the surprise in your cereal box, you never know who you're going to get but they're both nasty as all heck.
