
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MAJORITY OF NC VOTERS DISAPPROVE OF TRUMP COOPER HAS POSITIVE RATING, BUT MANY HAVE NO OPINION YET


A majority of North Carolina voters disapprove of President Donald Trump's job performance, while a plurality approve of Governor Roy Cooper's.

Statewide, 52% of voters said they disapprove of Trump's performance, while 43% approved and 5% were undecided. Not surprisingly, the evaluation of Trump splits sharply along party lines with 81% of Democrats disapproving and 79% of Republicans approving. Independents voters disapprove by a 49%-42% margin.

Most men approve of Trump (49%-44%), while a significant majority of women disapprove (59%-37%). State voters also split along racial lines, as an overwhelming majority of African-American voters (87%) disapprove of Trump and a majority of whites (56%) approve.



Statewide, 47% of North Carolina voters approve of Governor Roy Cooper's job performance, while 36% disapprove and a significant 17% still have no opinion.



State voters are also divided upon party lines, with 74% of Democrats and 42% of Independents approving, while 69% of Republicans indicated that they disapprove.

HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Research, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from November 17 through November 20, 2017. A total of 625 registered North Carolina voters were interviewed statewide by telephone.

Those interviewed were randomly selected from a phone-matched North Carolina voter registration list that included both land-line and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to reflect voter registration by county.

The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than ± 4 percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.
