#### 48. Phalaenopsis species

All species regardless of color or markings including "x self".







#### 49. Phalaenopsis hybrids, White, no markings

For white with colored lip use class 45. Can have slight coloration inside lip. Use class 47 for white multiflora regardless of markings.







## 50. Phalaenopsis hybrids, White with colored lip, no markings

Has prominent lip color. For any color markings except lip use a later class including blush, spots, bars, blotches & dots. Only White has separate class for colored lip.

#### 51. Phalaenopsis hybrids, White with markings.

Background must be white with spots, dots, blotches or bars.







## 52. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Multiflora, White, with or without markings.

Must be self-branching with less than 3" wide flowers. Lip color does not matter.







## 53. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Pink, no markings.

May show slight veining due to flower tissue but not a contrasting color. Use Class 49 for blush, spots, bars, blotches & dots.

#### 54. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Pink, with markings.

Must have a pink tone to the back.







## 55. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Multiflora, Pink with or without markings.

Must be self-branching with less than 3" wide flowers. Lip color does not matter.





# 56. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Yellow, no markings.

Ignore lip color. For any color markings except lip use Class 52 for blush, spots, bars, blotches & dots.

#### 57. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Yellow, with markings.

Must be self-branching with less than 3" wide flowers. Lip color does not matter.







## 59. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Other colors, no markings.

Mostly orange, maroon, greens, red & purple flowers or intense combinations of dense colors. No dominant background color that is white, pink or yellow.

#### 60. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Other colors, with markings.

Dark purple, orange, & red go here.







## 62. Phalaenopsis hybrids, Blushes.

Shows a pastel color suffusion primarily emanating from the petal base. Usually the blush is pink. Light spotting but heavy spotting should be in previous color classes not here.
