§ 214-1. Purpose

Village of Lyndon Station allowing bow-hunting of whitetail deer, bear and turkey within Village limits under ordinance number 214. The ordinance is restrictive to protect public safety and the rights of property owners including those that may choose not to allow hunting / bow and arrow target practice on their property.

§214-2. Requirements

Specifically, the ordinance requires the following:

- A. Hunting requires a 200' separation distance between the point where the hunting arrow is released and any public or commercial building, public road, park, or residence unless the hunter owns or resides at that residence. This requirement excludes most properties in the Village.
- B. Compliance with all rules and regulations of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and Village ordinances. (Bow-hunting of deer, bear and turkey in the Village follows the normal Wisconsin DNR Archery Deer and Turkey Season dates.)
- C. Hunters must obtain written permission of any property owner within a minimum 200' radius of the proposed hunting location, or a signed statement declaring the hunter owns the property. This written permission must be provided upon being contacted by Law Enforcement.
- D. Target practice with Bow and Arrow is also allowed within the Village if the target has a back drop of 4' x 8' and has a 100' separation distance between the point where the arrow is released and any public or commercial building, public road, park, or residence unless the individual owns or resides at that residence, and the target practice is conducted in a safe manner.

§ 214-3. Violations and penalties.

Any person who shall violate any provisions of this chapter shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500 together with the costs of said proceedings and upon failure to pay said forfeiture and costs shall be confined to the county jail of Juneau County for a period not to exceed 10 days or until such forfeiture and costs are paid.
