

From the Finance Committee:

For the past 3-4 years our budget donations have fallen short of meeting our annual expenses by an average of \$22,000. Bills have been paid by using reserve funds accumulated in the past. It is apparent that this is not sustainable and should it persist, reserves will be depleted within four years.

We are encouraged by recent attendance trends and Pastor Sandy's leadership and energy. Our hope is that this renewed energy will lead to increasing attendance and revenue. We can be certain that God has a plan for Grace. As it says in Jeremiah 29 verse 11, God has "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." The Finance Committee encourages all members to be in prayer for God to reveal what that future is for our continued ministry in the community.

The Committee would ask that each member consider one of two options. First, would be to donate one additional month's giving before the end of the year. Second, the Committee would ask that you consider a donation to the budget if you plan on doing year-end giving.
