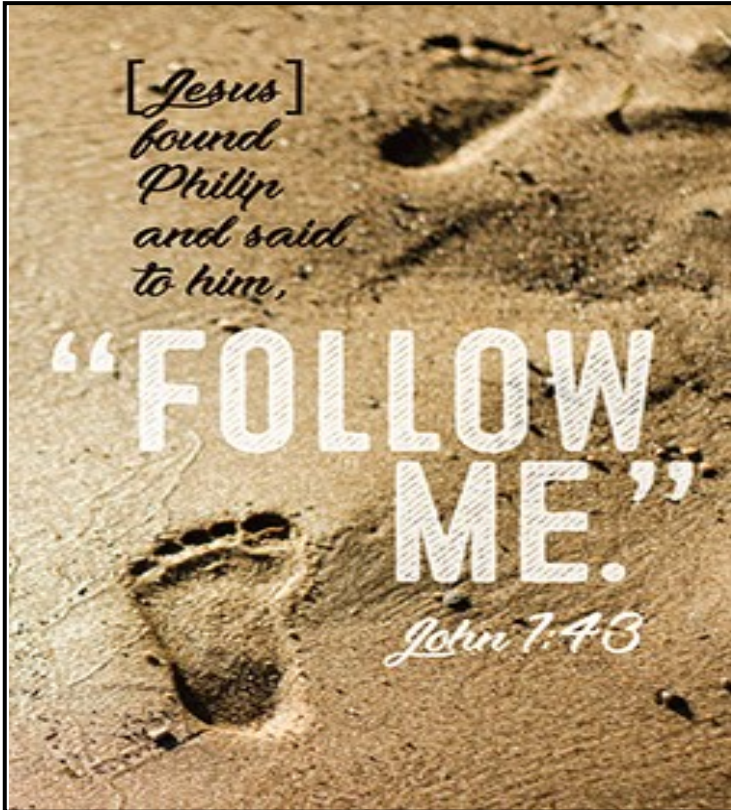

Central Pennsylvania World Hunger Association (Meat Canning) is the mission for January. This is the 39th year for meat canning. The goal this year is to can 30,000 pounds of turkey. Through the support of donations, they have been able to feed five and a half million people in central PA. The Association keeps 10% of the canned meat here in Central PA for local needy people.
