

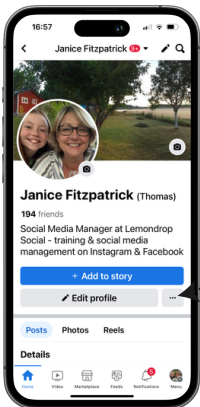


HOW TO CHECK FOR FACEBOOK SCAM EMAILS ON YOUR PHONE

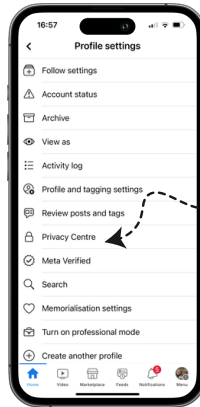
If you receive an email supposedly from Facebook telling you that your business page is about to be deleted, don't panic!

Follow these steps on your phone's Facebook app to find out if it's legitimate.

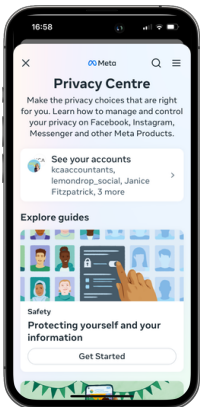
Open the Facebook app and from the home page, tap the circle with your profile picture in it. This will bring up your profile page.



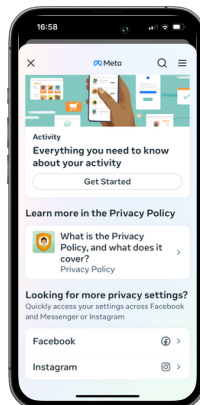
Now tap the three dots next to the Edit profile button.



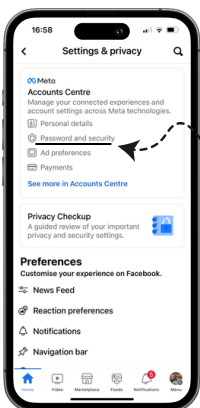
Now select the Privacy Centre option



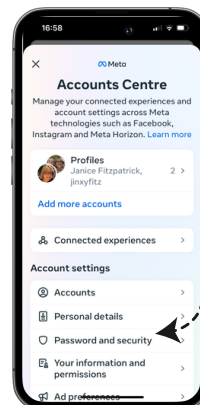
Next, scroll down right to the bottom of this page until you see the Facebook and Instagram options.



If you tap Facebook you'll be brought to the Meta Accounts Centre page.



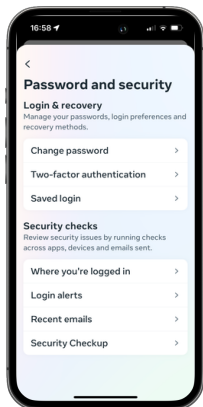
Now tap Password & Security.



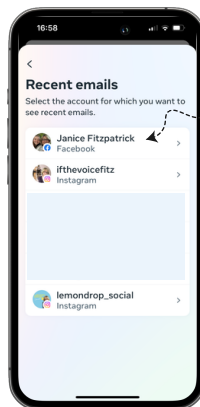
And select it again on the next page



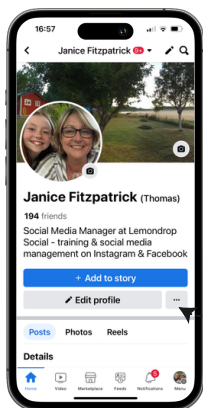
STILL WITH ME? GOOD...



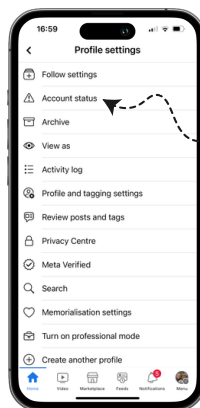
Finally, select Recent emails and then the Facebook option (you may have multiple Facebook accounts or an Instagram account)



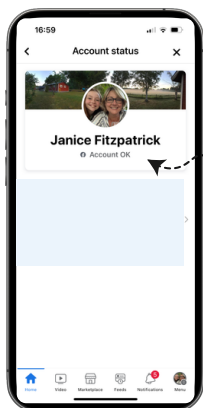
Tapping this selection will then bring up a list of recent emails that have been legitimately sent by Facebook.



Another way to check if your account is OK or subject to some irregularities is to start back at your profile page, tap the three dots...



And this time, select Account status.



This will then tell you if your account is OK.

If there are irregularities or legitimate emails from Facebook with concerns over your account then you will need to report to Facebook.

Make sure you have Two Factor Authentication switched on to prevent anyone from hacking your account.
