MEETING MINUTES

Milwaukee Philatelic Society General Membership Meeting - October 3, 2023

Officer Attendance: President Dave Hunsicker, Vice-President Blayne Kirsch, Secretary MaryAnn Bowman, Treasurer Bob Mather. Directors: Bill Gedemer, Jonathan Kumbera, Chris Proeber and Gaylord Yost. Past-President: Gary Meyer.

The meeting was called to order by President David Hunsicker.

The secretary's minutes for September were approved by voice vote.

The treasurer's report: Regarding Milcopex, Bob was optimistic that the show might have a small profit altho there are still some outstanding bills. He was pleased with the donations made by individuals as well as by Federation clubs. There was no rental "penalty" for food brought in by dealers and guests - a problem that was incurred last year. Other member questions were answered or clarified. The financial report through September 22, 2023, was distributed. It showed a savings account balance of \$4,971.72, three \$5000 CDs of \$15,387.37, the checking account balance of \$21,583.670 and cash on hand of \$73.45. The report was approved by voice vote.

Committee and officers reports:

Education: A new book for the library was donated by Ron Yahr.

Youth: 25 people stopped at the Milcopex Beginner's table. There were 4 youth. \$16.50 in donations were collected.

Editor: none

Programs - The October meeting will feature different mini-presentations on several basics of the hobby. Blayne Kirsch will offer information about first day covers, Jonathan Kumbera will discuss color, and Gary Meyer will talk about perforations. November will feature the fall major auction and a holiday party is planned for December.

Milcopex - Set up of frames and exhibits went very well due to having plenty of volunteer help. Although the audiences at the educational programming was small, it was noted that due to them being offered via Zoom, there was an international audience with Israel, South Africa, India and the United kingdom being represented. Members will be able to access the programs at their leisure from the Milcopex website. The Postcrossing event was well attended. It was suggested that perhaps dealers be given a questionnaire at the end of the show to determine their satisfaction. There were 252 registration slips turned in but it was noted that many committee members, dealers, volunteers, and other known society members had not filled out a registration form.

Stampfest - none

APS - It was reported that a French individual who is claiming to be moving to our state is a fraudulent request and are urged not to respond to it.

WFSC - The dates for the show are May 4 & 5 at the Radisson, a new venue. The show theme will focus on the invention of the typewriter as well as other Wisconsin inventions.

ATA - Bob Mather reported that he is being interviewed and will be a lead feature of an upcoming Topical Time issue.

Newsletter - Jonathan has a need for stamps with denominations of 25¢ or higher so that he can use the supply of lower valued stamps that have been donated on the club mailings. It was suggested that he contact Michael Mules for discount postage. There was again discussion of sending the newsletter electronically to members.

MEETING MINUTES

Guest: Girard Madritsch, collector of US and Vatican, introduced himself.

New Business: Bob Mather suggested that Gary Meyer be made an honorary member of the MPS citing his role in discovering and following through with the expertization and eventual auction sale of the 502e classic stamp. Gary promptly declined. Dave Hunsicker suggested that criteria be developed prior to initiation of honorary membership. The discussion was tabled and will be the subject of a future Board meeting.

Nominating Committee - Dave reported that a committee will be formed to solicit names for officer positions. Several current officers have agreed to run again.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:22 p.m.

Door prize drawing was won by Jim Stollenwerk.

The evening concluded with several minipresentations as described above. It was followed by an auction.
