In the winter months, when biting cold creeps into New England waters and our seas sit largely empty of humpback whales, avid whale watchers of the north wait with bated breath for news from the south.

There, among the sheltered bays and reefs of the Caribbean, humpbacks from across much of the Atlantic Ocean converge to mate, give birth, and begin raising calves. From the feeding grounds in the Gulf of Maine, this journey covers over a thousand miles and can take weeks to complete. All throughout, they are not eating, living entirely off the fat reserves they built up during their time on the summer feeding grounds.
