ATTENDANCE:

Florida Law states that children who are six (5) by February 1st must attend school regularly until their 18th birthday, unless they are exempt or have been expelled by the Corey Maurice Jackson Academy.

Every parent/guardian is solely responsible for the student's attendance. A student who has 15 unexcused absences within 90 calendar days is a habitual truant under the state law. The student may be dealt with as a child in need of services under Chapter 39, Florida Statues. In addition, the parent/guardian may be subject to criminal prosecution under Chapter 232, Florida Statues. Excessive absentees could result in student not being promoted to the next grade level.

A student between the ages of 16 and 18 may file a formal declaration of intent to terminate school enrollment and will then not be subject to compulsory school attendance. This declaration must be signed by the student and the parent/guardian.

RIGHTS OF OUR STUDENTS:

- To be informed by the Corey Maurice Jackson Academy regarding rules on absenteeism (this includes excused and unexcused) and tardiness
- To make up any class work/test within an appropriate length of time when there is an excused absence.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF OUR STUDENTS:

- To attend classes daily and to be on time
- To provide adequate documentation explaining all absences
- To request all, make up assignments/tests from teachers upon arrival back to school (from an excused absence) and complete them within the timeframe appointed by the teacher. The teacher will have 24 hours to provide the student with the missing assignment/test.

EXCUSED ABSENCES:

Students, per the state law, are required to attend school unless their absence can be deemed as excused by providing the proper documentation. It is the sole responsibility of the student's parent/guardian to explain the nature of the absence to the school and to have this reason approved by the Director. Reasons for excused absences include (but are not limited to):

- Sickness, injury, death of an immediate family member or some other describable issue in which a parental note will suffice.
- Documented appointments with doctors (of any profession).
- Documented absence for religion instructions or holidays
- Participation in academic activities approved by the director
- Court appearances (copy of subpoena required)

COREY MARUICE JACKSON ACADEMY DRESS CODE:

BOYS:

- All boys are required to wear the CMJ Academy uniform shirts unless they participate in dress down day on Fridays. If students wear collar shirt (uniform style), they are not required to have CMJ Academy logo on their shirts, but if T-Shirt style shirts are worn, CMJ Academy logo must be on shirt.
- All boys are prohibited from wearing saggy pants and/or shorts. If pants/shorts have a belt loop, a belt must be worn (properly).
- Pants must be either Khaki or jean material (to accompany uniform shirts)
- NO pants are to be worn below the waist

GIRLS:

- All girls are required to wear the CMJ Academy uniform shirts unless they participate in dress down day on Fridays. If students wear collar shirt (uniform style), they are not required to have CMJ Academy logo on their shirts, but if T-Shirt style shirts are worn, CMJ Academy logo must be on shirt.
- Shorts/skirts must be no shorter than three inches above the kneecap
- Rip jeans can only be worn on Fridays (not with uniform shirts) and if rips are in inappropriate areas, rip jeans must be worn with tights underneath
- If tights or leggings are worn on dress down day (Fridays), they must be covered by a shirt that is at least thigh length

** On Wednesdays – Chapel Day – All students will wear burgundy uniform shirts with khaki pants**

SHOES:

- Shoes must be safe and appropriate. It is advised that athletic shoes are worn during physical education activities
- No bedroom slippers, shoes with wheels or Crocs

THE FOLLOWING IS PROHIBITED:

- Clothing that reveals private body areas or undergarments
- Clothing and/or accessories that are dangerous to health or safety and are deem as distracting

- Sleepwear or outer garments
- Hat, headgear, headphones, earbuds (unless being used for assignments), hoodies, and/or bandanas
- Jewelry or accessories that can be hazardous to others and that can be used as a weapon such as: spiked jewelry, fishhooks, rubber bands, and/or chains

The Director has the authority to decide if the clothing worn by students complies with dress code policy.

DISCIPLINE:

The Corey Maurice Jackson Academy does not tolerate:

- Bullying
- Striking another student or staff member
- Foul language
- Insubordination

These offenses will lead to an immediate write up and parent conference and can ultimately lead to expulsion from the Corey Maurice Jackson Academy

CELL PHONES:

Students will NOT be allowed to have cell phones out during class work/instruction time. If cell phones are out, they will be confiscated, and parents/guardians will have to come and pick them up.

GRADING SYSTEM:

This grading system applies to grade levels $1^{st} - 12^{th}$ grade.

Any grade below a 60% is a failing grade.

Grades are combined using the below method:

Test – 45% of Grade

Self-Test – 20% of Grade

Assignments – 20% of Grade

Participation (behavior) – 15% of Grade

Students will have 24 hours to make up all missed work from excused absences (unless the Director allots additional time). Failing to turn in assignments will result in a zero (0).

SCHEDULE CHANGES:

All schedules are established according to the needs of our students. The information from transcripts have been considered, when selecting classes for the 2024-2025 school year. The only reason we may schedule changes are:

- Student needs new courses that are just being offered
- Course student is currently taking is too difficult for student to maintain passing grades
- Student requires a change to correct behavioral and/or safety issues
- Student needs remediation
- Student has a medical excuse
- Student has already taken and PASSED the subject
